## What Kind of Church is Redeemer?

### Location

We minister in the middle of [Winston-Salem](#) – a city whose growth has been marked by decades of work to bring higher education, business, art, and innovation to the Piedmont area of North Carolina.

Our campus sits on the road between two major hospitals and is 2 miles away from our city center. The [Ardmore neighborhood](#) is the original suburb, first called Mortgage Hill because it was the first community in which you could get a bank loan to build a house. It is a large neighborhood with plenty of small and local businesses but it is definitively a neighborhood. We sit at the center of it adjacent to an active city park.

### Gospel Focused

RPC has a rich history of believing, sharing, and living in the reality of Jesus and his mission in the world. Steeped in the foundation of grace, we believe it forgives and frees us toward humility and courage, mercy and justice, and patience and hope.

### Mission Driven

We have planted multiple churches, spearheaded several non-profits, and have sent out dozens of missionaries. In 1995, we started [Redeemer School](#), a Charlotte Mason-inspired Christian school that has grown into an independent organization that offers Transitional Kindergarten (TK) through eighth grade.

### Leadership

We live into a shared leadership marked by collaboration, trust, and curiosity. We don't always do it well, but that is our heart. We are led by elders, deacons, deaconesses, and a women's council who commit annually to our "[Way of Life Together Document](#)" that marks our commitments to fidelity, humility, and stability.

### People

We are a mostly White and middle to upper class church. We have people from all over the political spectrum. We don't shy away from our differences, but engage them in ways that attempt to bring unity and clarity. There are about 550 of us now but we are growing steadily. Our demographics are a bell curve that skews younger but we have as many folks over 50 as we do under 11.
