<p>HAND IN HAND MINISTRY</p> <p>Room 105 (next to Children's Ministry Office)</p>	<p>The adult hand-in-hand class started a new curriculum this fall called "Awe and Wonder" based on Psalm 65:8 which says "the whole earth is filled with awe at your wonders". This curriculum follows the big story of Jesus, the Old Testament in the fall and the New Testament in the spring. We have adaptive levels, hand on activities and brightly colored visuals to teach concepts. We'd love to have you join!</p>
<p>ADULT CLASS</p> <p>PARENTING - Justin Edgar Room 110</p>	<p>Parenting is not about perfection, but about love and connection. At every stage of childhood-through infancy, adolescence and young adulthood - our calling as parents is to stay present, to see our kids, soothe them and remain attuned. At its heart, Christian parenting is about attachment and attunement, about being safe, engaged, and available, even when life feels overwhelming or our children pull away.</p> <p>Join us as we engage in our own stories, regulate our expectations and emotions, practice repair when we fail, and grow in our attunement and engagement with our children. The class will attempt to dispel some of the notions of perfect Christian Parenting, as well as attempt to explore how the gospel invites us to release control, embrace imperfection, and trust that God's love does what we cannot.</p>
<p>ADULT CLASS</p> <p>HOW TO READ THE BIBLE - Giorgio Hiatt Library (Room 114)</p> <p>This class starts January 18 through February 15</p>	<p>Join us in exploring foundational principles of what is called hermeneutics - the art, science, and practice of reading Scripture well. As Scripture is not primarily information to comprehend but orientation toward God and neighbor, we will concentrate on both good methods for understanding and a humble posture toward the Bible. You will learn the importance of contexts, genres, literary devices, historical backgrounds, and other interpretive principles. But you will learn to expect that all of Scripture's aim is to form you after the image of Christ, and read well, it intends to form our affections, desires, and behaviors.</p>
