



1. THERE IS NOTHING NORMAL LEADING UP TO JESUS' BIRTH.

- a. There's nothing normal about the experience of Zachariah and Elizabeth.
 - (1) The angelic visitation.
 - (2) God's way is not by sword but word, not might but light.
 - (3) A baby for the barren elderly Elizabeth.
- b. There's nothing normal about the experience of Mary and Joseph.
 - (1) Another angelic visitation.
 - (2) Conception of a child by a virgin.
 - (3) Mary's song: He brings the lofty down, and lifts up the lowly. The hungry are filled, and the rich are empty.

2. THERE IS NOTHING NORMAL ABOUT JESUS' BIRTH.

- a. The Messiah in a Manger is not normal.
 - (1) A feed trough for a crib. A stable for a nursery.
 - (2) You would not expect a baby.
- b. Heavenly angels announce glory in the highest to the earthly shepherd lowest.
- c. The old Temple ceremonies are not normal.

3. THERE IS NOTHING NORMAL AFTER JESUS' BIRTH.

- a. The visit of the Magi from the East was not normal.
- b. The flight to Egypt was not normal.
- c. His Temple visit at age twelve was not normal.
- d. The "not normal" in rest of Luke's Gospel.
 - (1) The boldness of John the Baptist.
 - (2) The voice of God and the Spirit descending at his baptism.
 - (3) He says, "Blessed are the Broken."
