




ANNUAL MEN'S SUMMIT AT CAMP TADMOR

MESSAGE NOTES

"MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER IN A 'NEW DAY' CHALLENGE" – JOSHUA 1

INTRODUCTION: Wouldn't it be great if there were a biscuit, magic pill, power drink, or a shot of adrenalin serum that could give you the strength and courage you need for any challenge!

What is your 'new day' challenge for this season?

Where do you get the strength and courage to do what God wants you to do?

1. Joshua and Israel faced a 'new day' challenge.
 - a. This is a dramatic historical moment.
 - b. Moses is dead.
 - c. Joshua is Moses' chosen successor.
 - d. This is an exciting and daunting 'new day' challenge.
 - "You can't take The Promised Land if you're still facing The Wilderness."

Application: "Let it go!" "Let it go!"

- "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God." (Lk. 9:62)
- "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." (Eph. 4:31-32)
- "Make every effort to live in peace with everyone and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many." (Heb. 12:14-15)

2. God calls Joshua to be strong & courageous based on his presence and promise.
 - a. God declares his presence as the foundation for movement and conquest.
 - b. God declares his promise as the means for movement and conquest.
 - (1) This promise is God's doing.
 - (2) This promise is in His written Word.
 - (3) This means we should be consumed by the Word.

Application: We are given the same priority concerning the Bible in the New Testament.

- "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." (Heb. 13:5)
- "Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Mt. 28:20)
- "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth." (2 Tim. 2:15)

3. Joshua and Israel respond in obedience moving forward together.
 - a. Joshua gives an immediate command to the officers and the people.
 - b. Joshua gives a command in the immediate challenge of the Trans-Jordan Tribes.
 - c. The Trans-Jordan Tribes give their immediate obedient response.

Application: We can take possession of what God is giving us as a "mission" church.

- A Museum church: hollow and empty with pictures of the past
- A Maintenance church: in survival mode to just keep focused on the past and present
- A Ministry church: in business for its own people only
- A Mission church: ready to move out together into the world for the Lord

CONCLUSION: Strength and courage for a 'new day' challenge come from God's presence and promise, and our obedience moving forward together.
