MESSAGE NOTES

Moving Forward: “The Day the Sun Stood Still” [Joshua 9-10]

INTRODUCTION: “No battle plan survives the first encounter with the enemy.”
 In other words, “Because of ‘unanticipatables,’ things WILL get messy!”

This is true of life in a fallen world and the Christian life.
How do we handle it? How will God handle it?

REVIEW: The Conquest of the Promised Land requires:

- Risk: which demanded great courage. (ch. 1-3)
- Reliance on God: which began with consecration to God. (ch. 4-6)
- Rebellion: requiring confession of sin and cleansing. (ch. 7-8)
- Ruse: a trick for a treaty brining confusion needing correction. (ch.9-10)

1. Israel failed to inquire of the Lord.
 - a. This is a mixture of deception of others and a mistake by Joshua and Israel.
 - b. Having not invoked God for direction, they do invoke his Name for an oath.
 2. Israel’s blunder leads to a messy situation.
 - a. Joshua has an impossible dilemma.
 - b. Joshua comes up with permanent servitude as punishment that fits the crime.
- But what does God think about all this mess?**
3. God’s solution to the messy situation is mercy, judgment and victory.
 - a. The Lord shows his mercy and battles for Joshua & Israel+.
 - (1) God gives encouragement
 - (2) God spares the Gibeonites under Israel’s protection.
 - b. The Lord defeats his enemies in judgment.
 - (1) God gives confusion.
 - (2) God gives supernatural help. (Hailstones. Stopping the sun.)
 - (3) God brings victory to establish his kingdom.
 4. God’s solution to our messy battles is mercy, judgment and victory.
 - a. The Lord shows mercy for his own.
 - (1) God gives encouragement.
 - (2) God spares those who turn to him.
 - b. God defeats his enemies in judgment.
 - (1) God gives confusion.
 - (2) God gives us supernatural help.
 - (3) God brings victory for his kingdom.

**CONCLUSION: EVEN WHEN LIFE’S BATTLES GET MESSY
 THE LORD MOVES ALL CREATION FOR HIS PURPOSES AND HIS PEOPLE.**
