Dear Shandon United Methodist Friends and Families,

We hope that during this Easter season, you have enjoyed and found as much renewal of spirit and energy in each of your faith journeys as we have. From the first day of Ash Wednesday, to the triumphant procession into our sanctuary on Palm Sunday, to the glorious chords of "Christ the Lord Has Risen Today" on Easter morning, we have been blessed as a people, as a church, and most importantly, as God's children. We thank everyone for traveling this journey with us.

In recent years, as we have continued to move forward on this journey, we have often asked ourselves how we might ensure that we as a church continue to be good and faithful stewards of all the gifts that our Almighty God has bestowed upon us — both now and for generations to come.

In 2023, your Finance Committee created the Task Force for Stewardship and Budgeting. NEW BUSES FOR SAFER, MORE COMFORTABLE TRAVEL

Shandon will soon have three new buses, thoughtfully chosen to better serve our congregation. All three will be equipped with 360degree cameras to give drivers better visibility, especially when backing up or watching for small children around the bus. Each bus also includes power passenger loading doors, which make boarding easier and eliminate the struggle with difficult manual doors.

Two of the new buses were designed specifically for our preschool and children. These include an integrated five-point passenger restraint system, an added safety measure we felt was important. A child-check alarm system on these buses requires the driver to walk to the back and press a button after the bus is turned off. If they forget, the bus loudly beeps until the check is complete. The system is there to ensure that no child or person is ever left behind on the bus.

The third vehicle, the Connections Bus, was created with older adults in mind. It features soft cloth seats with padding and armrests, lighted passenger loading steps, and a built-in extended handrail for easier entry. Fabric-insulated ceilings and walls reduce noise, making conversation easier, while individual seat lights, improved air circulation, and a better air-ride type system offer a more comfortable ride.

We expect the Connections Bus to be ready within the month. When it arrives, we'll host a "sip and see" between the 8:45 service and Sunday School. You'll have the opportunity to step aboard, take a seat, and explore the new features for yourself.

The new buses were purchased thanks to a generous legacy gift from a member who included Shandon in their estate plans. We are deeply grateful to the Board of Trustees for their support of this project and to Donald Tudor, Chair of the Property Committee, whose school transportation expertise guided our decisions. We also thank the generous members of Shandon who give beyond their annual pledge. Because of your faithful giving, we're able to invest in resources that enhance ministry and care for all ages in our church family.







School Bus Shuttle Bus?



While shuttle-style buses may appear more modern, state law requires school-age passengers to ride on a school bus-type vehicle. A school bus is one of the safest vehicles on the road. School buses are built to higher safety standards than other drivers, including reinforced structures, better visibility for drivers, and rigorous crash protection than other passenger vehicles.

As Donald Tudor, Chair of the Property Committee and retired state director of school transportation at the South Carolina Department of Education, shared, "Safety always comes first. We wanted a vehicle that could serve both preschoolers and older adults with confidence and long-term reliability."


HABITAT FOR HUMANITY








Over 125 participants gathered on April 6 to create Resurrection Eggs and prayer beads, engaging in a meaningful celebration of the Easter story.
