#### THE GLORIOUS MYSTERY

"Seven Stanzas at Easter" by John Updike

Make no mistake: if He rose at all

it was as His body;

if the cells' dissolution did not reverse, the molecules reknit, the amino acids rekindle, the Church will fall.

It was not as the flowers, each soft spring recurrent; it was not as His Spirit in the mouths and fuddled eyes of the eleven apostles; it was as His flesh: ours.

The same hinged thumbs and toes, the same valved heart that-- pierced-- died, withered, paused, and then regathered out of enduring Might new strength to enclose.

Let us not mock God with metaphor, analogy, sidestepping, transcendence, making of the event a parable, a sign painted in the faded credulity of earlier ages: let us walk through the door.

The stone is rolled back, not papier-mache, not a stone in a story, but the vast rock of materiality that in the slow grinding of time will eclipse for each of us the wide light of day.

And if we will have an angel at the tomb, make it a real angel, weighty with Max Planck's quanta, vivid with hair, opaque in the dawn light, robed in real linen spun on a definite loom.

Let us not seek to make it less monstrous, for our own convenience, our own sense of beauty, lest, awakened in one unthinkable hour, we are embarrassed by the miracle, and crushed by remonstrance.

The glorious mystery of our faith is that, through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, God has defeated the powers of sin, death, and evil in this world. In the words of John Updike, "Let us walk through the door" and experience the glory of Easter – God's eternal life now and forever!




#### **MEN'S PRAYER BREAKFAST**

#### MORE JUSTICE AND SHANDON UMC ... A GREAT PARTNERSHIP

What does the Lord require of you? To do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8

Shandon is involved in many ministries that "love mercy". Our church family contributes time, talents, and money toward efforts that show compassion to others.

Our partnership with MORE Justice gives us the opportunity to comply with God's directive to "do justice." Justice holds our leaders accountable for the fair treatment of everyone in our community. Nehemiah Chapter 5 teaches us how God wants us to "do justice." Citizens of Jerusalem were starving and were forced into unsurmountable debt to save themselves, ultimately losing their homes, crops, land, and children to greedy money lenders. Nehemiah used his righteous anger to gather the people together in a great assembly, demanding that the lenders return everything to the people. When faced with the power of the entire community, they had no choice but to comply.

MORE Justice gathers members of 27 congregations in our community to convince our public officials of policies and practices needed to "do justice." We need to increase our great assembly!

#### MORE Justice is working on four major efforts in our community:

- Food Justice: Around 65,000 Richland County residents face food insecurity. MORE Justice has partnered with the City of Columbia's Food Policy Committee to use public land in low-access areas for pop-up markets, produce stands, and community gardens. A mobile market—a grocery store on wheels —was also created to bring food directly into neighborhoods. More work is needed to ensure these programs succeed and last.
- Affordable Housing: About 16,000 Columbia families spend over 30% of their income on housing. In Richland County, 44.8% of renters do the same. A minimum-wage earner would need to work 89 hours a week to afford a one-bedroom apartment. MORE Justice helped create a local Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF), with \$4 million committed or planned by Richland County Council. Continued effort is needed to fully fund the AHTF.
- **Gun Violence:** Community members have shared stories of families hearing gunshots at night, of grief because of losses of loved ones to gun violence, and of anger at feeling unsafe in their own communities. MORE Justice has worked with local officials to create the Office of Violent Crime Prevention to help oversee the reduction of the gun violence crisis. More work is needed to ensure best practices are implemented.
- **Mental Health:** Many community members report despair and a lack of mental health resources. First responders are often unprepared to handle crises. Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) equips them to respond safely. Over 300 officers have been trained to divert people in crisis toward help instead of jail. More training and support are still needed.

#### **QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD)**

BEFORE TAKING REQUIRED DISTRIBUTION THIS YEAR FROM YOUR INDIVIDUAL RETIREMENT ACCOUNT, CONSIDER CONSULTING YOUR TAX ADVISOR ABOUT A QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION ("QCD").

IRA owners, age 73 or older, are required to take annual distributions from their tax-deferred IRAs based on IRS guidelines/instructions (tax-free Roth IRAs are excluded), and certain owners of inherited IRAs may have Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) in 2025. Generally, these distributions are taxable as income and may cause a loss of other tax benefits and/or increase Medicare premiums. Ouch, Ouch!

As stewards of the financial resources God has entrusted to us, it is not only wise, but prudent to use these resources in the most tax and cost-efficient manner possible. So, if you are required to take a minimum distribution this year and plan to contribute to Shandon UMC this year, consider a QCD.

To do that, you should consult your tax advisor, but here's how it generally works if properly done: the amount of the QCD can count towards the amount of the RMD without being taxed as income, but the QCD must be made before making the RMD. Excluding the QCD from taxable income essentially saves the giver income taxes at their marginal tax rate. Of course, since the QCD is not included as taxable income, it is not deductible on the giver's tax return (that would be "double dipping").



As stewards of the financial resources God has entrusted to us, it is not only wise but prudent to use these resources in the most tax and cost-efficient manner possible.

In short, the QCD allows givers to use their donation to Shandon UMC (or another charity) to help satisfy their RMDs, save on taxes, and, as mentioned above, may have other benefits. What a great way to satisfy your RMDs while giving to Shandon UMC!

**Note:** This article is for general information only and is not intended to give personal, specific, or any other tax advice to any reader. There are limits and rules that apply to QCDs depending on your personal situation, so be sure to consult your tax adviser before proceeding or taking any action based on this article.
