"I WAS IN PRISON AND YOU VISITED ME" ... The Kairos Prison Ministry for McCormick Correctional Institution in McCormick, SC is having its next "Walk" on March 18-21. A typical Kairos event will go through 4,000 dozen cookies which are distributed to residents, correction officers, support staff and volunteers.

Please bring cookies to Wesley Hall during the week of March 10 but no later than March 17. There will be a table with a Kairos sign on it.

Acceptable types of cookies are: oatmeal, peanut butter, chocolate chip, molasses, ginger, lemon. Cookies that are uniform in size (no larger than 2 ½ ") pack best and resist breakage. Very important: NO icing, sugar toppings, sprinkles, fruit, powdered sugar or any coating/glaze on outside of cookie, and please use creamy peanut butter in PB cookies. Place baked cookies in clear bags and, if possible, in a box to prevent breakage during transport.
