January 25: What does it mean to live in a community? Join us from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. for dinner, games, and Bible study in the Youth Zone.

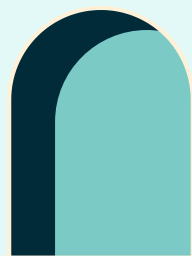

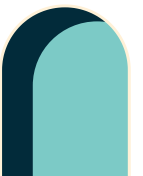
