# WWJP? (WHERE WOULD JESUS PARK?)

Well, of course, Jesus walked everywhere, so he wouldn't actually have to deal with the parking challenges we face on Sundays! But seriously, we need to be *very* careful and considerate in our parking habits. A few friendly suggestions ...

- 1. The lot beside the church is important for those with mobility challenges, young children, and our first-time visitors. Please pay careful attention to handicap parking signs, including those for handicap accessible vans.
- 2. The lot across Devine Street is our largest parking lot. On most Sundays we have an off-duty police officer to assist us in crossing the street. On the relatively rare occasions when no officer is available, please be sure to use the crosswalks.
- 3. Our friends at Dreher kindly share their front lot with us. Please do not park on the grass anywhere on the Dreher property.
- 4. There are a number of parking spaces on Adger Road. Please do not park by the yellow curb sections of Adger Road, especially close to the intersection.
- 5.**Please respect our business neighbors.** The businesses near our campus (Exxon, CVS, EarthFare, Dunkin) have limited parking available for their customers. Please do not park in any of the spots that are intended for their customer use.
