#### **DISCOVERING THE HOLY SPIRIT**

"The Forgotten God." "The Go-Between God." These are ways some theologians have described the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the "hidden" person of the Trinity -- the one we know the least about, the one we think the least about. The Holy Spirit works behind the scenes -- within us, through us -- without our realizing it.

Even the Apostles' Creed (and the original form of the Nicene Creed) reinforces this perspective. "God the Father Almighty" does something truly remarkable: God creates heaven and earth. The large paragraph in the middle of the Creed is devoted to Jesus: his birth, death, resurrection, and ascension for the salvation of the world. But then we come to the Holy Spirit: just a single sentence, "I believe in the Holy Spirit."

Believe what? What does the Holy Spirit do in the world? Where can we see the Holy Spirit? Who is this hidden, mysterious third person of the Trinity? What should we know about the Holy Spirit? How can I know and experience the Holy Spirit personally? We hope our summer sermon series will help point you toward answers for questions like these.

## **CHRISMON CLASS**



# SAFE SANCTUARY MONTHLY HIGHLIGHT

Shandon's Child & Youth Abuse Prevention Procedures Reminder of the Month: "Two-Adults Rule" (Part A) One adult shall not be in a room, area, or vehicle with a single child or youth at any time, on or off campus.

Two or more policy-certified adults shall be present during any church-sponsored program, event, or ministry involving children (infants - 5th graders). When two of these adults are related, another unrelated Safe Sanctuary-certified adult shall be present.

At drop-off, a parent shall wait with the child until two unrelated, policy-certified leaders/teachers are present.
