DAY 2 – The Power of Honor

SCRIPTURE TO READ:

Philippians 2:3

Optional Additional Reading: Romans 12:10; Mark 10:43-45

THINK IT THROUGH:

Honor is not flattery—it's recognizing the worth God has placed in someone. When Paul tells us to "esteem others better," he isn't calling us to belittle ourselves; he's calling us to elevate others.

Honor is a relational posture of surrender. It means:

- I don't always need to win.
- I don't always need to be first.
- I don't always need to be right.

Jesus modeled this by washing feet, welcoming children, and serving those who would later deny Him. Honor is the way of Christ.

PUT IT INTO PRACTICE:

Choose one relationship where you tend to protect your pride. Today, choose humility. Listen longer. Speak gentler. Yield where you normally push.

PRAYER FOR TODAY:

"Father, reshape my heart so I can honor others the way Jesus honored others. Remove selfish ambition and give me a spirit of humility." Amen.
