# BUILT FOR MORE: BREAKING FREE FROM LAZINESS

#### **TODAY'S PASSAGE:**

### Proverbs 6:6-11 (NLT) -

6 Take a lesson from the ants, you lazybones. Learn from their ways and become wise! 7 Though they have no prince or governor or ruler to make them work, 8 they labor hard all summer, gathering food for the winter. 9 But you, lazybones, how long will you sleep? When will you wake up? 10 A little extra sleep, a little more slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest—11 then poverty will pounce on you like a bandit; scarcity will attack you like an armed robber.

## Proverbs 6:6 (NLT) – Take a lesson from the ants, you lazybones. Learn from their ways and become wise!

- Laziness is a natural tendency diligence must be learned.
- God uses the ant as an example of hard work, selflessness, and unity.
- Ants don't wait to be told; they instinctively take action for the good of the whole.
- Laziness is often tied to a lack of vision. Without purpose, there is no motivation.


Proverbs 29:18 (KJV) - Where there is no vision, the people perish.

Hebrews 6:12 (ERV) - We don't want you to be lazy... but to inherit the promises.

Proverbs 6:7–8 (NLT) – Though they have no prince or governor or ruler to make them work, they labor hard all summer...

- Ants are self-motivated and forward-thinking.
- Waiting for someone to check you is a recipe for missed seasons.
- Winter represents challenges, scarcity, and hardship. Will you be ready?

Ephesians 5:16 (NLT) - Make the most of every opportunity...

Colossians 3:23 (NLT) – Work willingly at whatever you do, as though you were working for the Lord...

Are there any areas in your life where you've been waiting for someone to "push" you? How would your life look different if you started acting as though God were your direct supervisor?



Proverbs 6:9–11 (NLT) – A little extra sleep... then poverty will pounce on you like a bandit.

- Laziness seems harmless at first but over time, it destroys progress.
- There's a time to rest and a time to work don't confuse the two.
- Future success is tied to current faithfulness.

Proverbs 20:4 (NLT) - Those too lazy to plow in the right season...
