 - Just as Christ has accepted us, we must accept others. How can this attitude of acceptance strengthen relationships in the church family?
3. 1 John 4:4 states that we belong to God. What are some ways our value as individuals increases once we belong to God? (Scan Ephesians 1–2 for help.)
4. According to Isaiah 43:4, how does God view us?
 - How do we feel about those who are precious to us? How do we respond to those who treat us as precious to them? Knowing that God considers us precious, how should we respond to him?
 - We demonstrate God's love to others by serving them and God. How does utilizing our gifts and talents to serve others help to acknowledge our value to God?
5. What does Isaiah 54:10 say about God's love for us?
 - As humans, our love for one another is inconsistent. How is God's love different?
6. According to Isaiah 43:25, why does God forgive our sins? Will he remember them?
 - We often think that God is getting even with us when things go wrong in our lives. Why do we think this way?
 - Since God forgives our sins because of who he is, how should we, as believers, respond?
7. Read Ephesians 1:4. How does God view us?
 - What happens to our sin: past, present, and future, when we accept what Jesus did for us on the cross?
8. Read Philippians 4:13. What are we capable of with Christ's strength?
9. What does Romans 15:13 say about God and how he can change our outlook?
 - What steps can we take to ensure our view of the future remains positive and filled with hope?
