'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.' Deuteronomy 6:4-5 NIV

'This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. We love because he first loved us.' 1 John 4:10 & 19 NIV

'The Lord our God, the Lord is one.' Deuteronomy 6:4 NIV

'Love the Lord your God.' Deuteronomy 6:4 NIV

'And now, O Israel, what does the Lord your God ask of you but to fear the Lord your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul.' Deuteronomy 10:12 NIV

'Love the Lord your God and keep his requirements, his decrees, his laws and his commands always.' Deuteronomy 11:1 NIV

'So if you faithfully obey the commands I am giving you today—to love the Lord your God and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul.' Deuteronomy 11:13 NIV
