#### SMALL GROUP SERMON DISCUSSION

- 1. Have you ever lost or misplaced something that was important to you? How did you react? When you found it, how did you feel?
- 2. Read Luke 15:1-2. Jesus told the grumbling Pharisees parables about a lost sheep, a lost coin, and a lost son. What do we learn about Gods heart for people?
- 3. How are the Pharisees and religious people just as lost as the sinners they despised?
- 4. Read the Parable of the Prodigal Son in Luke 15:11-32.
  - What motivated the younger son to demand his inheritance from his father and what type of pain did the father likely experience?
  - What happened to the younger son after he left his father and what did the consequences of his wilful and selfish behaviour teach him?
  - How does sin promise enjoyment but brings enslavement? How does obedience to God's will bring true freedom?
  - How is true repentance different than regret or remorse?
  - How did his father react to seeing his son even before receiving the son's apology? How does this reflect Gods disposition towards a lost person returning to Him?
  - What was the older brother's reaction to return of his brother and the celebration?
  - List the ways the older brother showed unforgiveness to his brother and father. What joys did he miss out on because of his unforgiveness?
- 5. How does knowing that God seeks and saves lost sinners give us comfort and confidence in Him? How might this help us share the gospel with anyone?
- 6. What do we learn about God's reaction to our mistakes, failures, and times of rebellion? Do we draw near to Him or stay away until we can clean up our act?
- 7. What is the danger of harbouring any unforgiveness in our heart towards anyone? What are we missing out on because of it?
