Romans 15:7-16

Romans 14:1–16:23 is concerned with the motives and means of gospel mission in Paul's life and ministry. From beginning to end in the Bible, we see that God is a missionary God. Everyone falls short of his glory (Romans 3:23), so he wants the message of his righteousness revealed in his Son, Jesus Christ, to go out to everyone.

- 1. Read Romans 15:1-7. How is unity and acceptance between believers a good witness? What might that look like in reality?
- 2. What is the common denominator in all of the Old Testament texts Paul cites in Romans 15:9–12? What point is he driving home?
- 3. Read Romans 15:11. What does Paul mean here and how is God glorified?
- 4. In Romans 15:15, Paul says he has been 'bold' with the Romans, and in Romans 15:17 he says he has pride in his work. Is Paul sinning in such boldness and pride? What distinctions need to be made between 'good boldness' and 'bad boldness,' good pride and bad pride?
- 5. In 1 Corinthians 3:6, Paul says, 'I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth.' Compare this passage in 1 Corinthians to what Paul says in Romans 15:20–24. Taking these two texts together, how would you describe Paul's driving passion?
- 6. In what ways can we have a missional heart for people of all nations?
