1. We glorify God by _____ Jesus as Lord.

'So that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.' Philippians 2:10-11 NLT

'So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God.'
1 Corinthians 10:31 NIV

'My true disciples produce much fruit. This brings great glory to my Father.' John 15:8 NLT

2. We glorify God by our _____.

'We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves.'
Romans 15:1 NIV

'We should please others. If we do what helps them, we will build them up in the Lord. For even Christ didn't please himself. As the Scriptures say, "Those who insult you are also insulting me."' Romans 15:2-3 NLT

'May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you a spirit of unity among yourselves as you follow Christ Jesus, so that with one heart and mouth you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.' Romans 15:5-7 NIV

'So accept each other just as Christ has accepted you; then God will be glorified.'
Romans 15:7 NLT

'Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name—the name you gave me—so that they may be one as we are one.' John 17:11 NIV

'If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. 3. We glorify God by our _____.

'Be happy if you are insulted for being a Christian, for then the glorious Spirit of God will come upon you.' 1 Peter 4:14 NLT

'Yet if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in that name.' 1 Peter 4:16 ESV

'Everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.'
2 Timothy 3:12 NIV

'In this world you will have trouble.' John 16:33 NIV

'When the world hates you, remember it hated me before it hated you. The world would love you if you belonged to it, but you don't. I chose you to come out of the world, and so it hates you. Do you remember what I told you? 'A servant is not greater than the master.' Since they persecuted me, naturally they will persecute you.' John 15:18-20 NLT

4. We glorify God by _____ His Word.

'Finally, brothers and sisters, pray for us, so that the word of the Lord may spread rapidly and be glorified everywhere, just as it is among you.' 2 Thessalonians 3:1 NRSV

'And now the word of the Lord is ringing out from you to people everywhere, even beyond Greece, for wherever we go we find people telling us about your faith in God. We don't need to tell them about it, for they themselves keep talking about the wonderful welcome you gave us and how you turned away from idols to serve the true and living God.'
1 Thessalonians 1:8-9 NLT

'Now I commit you to God and to the word of his grace, which can build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.' Acts 20:32 NIV

'All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It straightens us out and teaches us to do what is right. It is God's way of preparing us in every way, fully equipped for every good thing God wants us to do.' 2 Timothy 3:16-17 NLT

5. We glorify God by _____ to Jesus.

'But this precious treasure—this light and power that now shine within us—is held in perishable containers, that is, in our weak bodies. So everyone can see that our glorious power is from God and is not our own. We are pressed on every side by troubles, but we are not crushed and broken. We are perplexed, but we don't give up and quit. We are hunted down, but God never abandons us. We get knocked down, but we get up again and keep going. Through suffering, these bodies of ours constantly share in the death of Jesus so that the life of Jesus may also be seen in our bodies. Yes, we live under constant danger of death because we serve Jesus, so that the life of Jesus will be obvious in our dying bodies. So we live in the face of death but it has resulted in eternal life for you.' 2 Corinthians 4:7-12 NLT

'All of these things are for your benefit. And as God's grace brings more and more people to Christ, there will be great thanksgiving, and God will receive more and more glory. That is why we never give up. Though our bodies are dying, our spirits are being renewed every day. For our present troubles are quite small and won't last very long. Yet they produce for us an immeasurably great glory that will last forever! So we don't look at the troubles we can see right now; rather, we look forward to what we have not yet seen. For the troubles we see will soon be over, but the joys to come will last forever.' 2 Corinthians 4:15-18 NLT

'To him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.' Ephesians 3:21 NIV

'Listen! Do not be proud, for the LORD has spoken. Give glory to the LORD your God before it is too late. Acknowledge him before he brings darkness upon you, causing you to stumble and fall on the dark mountains. For then, when you look for light, you will find only terrible darkness.'
