## The Power of Prayer ~3 How God answers our prayers. Luke 1:5-25

1. We must be willing to let God answer in His own
'Zechariah asked the angel, "How can I be sure of this? I am an old man and my wife is well on in years."' Luke 1:18 NIV
'The angel said to him, 'Do not be afraid Zechariah, your prayer has been heard." Luke 1:13 NIV
Keep on praying until one of three things happen:
1. You get the

3. You keep praying until God to you that it's not His will.

## 4. We must be willing to let God answer for His own

'To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints. I remember you in my prayers at all times; and I pray that now at last by God's will the way may be opened for me to come to you. I long to see you so that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to make you strong—that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith. I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that I planned many times to come to you (but have been prevented from doing so until now) in order that I might have a harvest among you, just as I have had among the other Gentiles. That is why I am so eager to preach the gospel also to you who are at Rome.' Romans 1:7, 10-15 NIV

'It has always been my ambition to preach the gospel where Christ was not known so that I would not be building on someone else's foundation. I plan to do so when I go to Spain. I hope to visit you while passing through and to have you assist me on my journey there, after I have enjoyed your company for a while. Also pray that by the will of God I may come to you with joy and be refreshed when I am with you.' Romans 15:20, 24, 32 NIV

## SMALL GROUP SERMON DISCUSSION

- 4. 'God is more interested in making you mature than He is about making life easy.' Do you agree or disagree with that statement? Explain why.
- 5. Read Isaiah 55:8. How are God's ways always better when He answers?
- 6. Sometimes when we pray, and if we are in tune with God, our prayers begin to change and the requests changes from what we started with. Can you give a personal example of that happening to you?
- 7. Look up **one** of these examples. Sarah and Abraham. Genesis 16&17, Mary and Martha. John 11:1-43, Jairus. Mark 5:21-43. What does it teach you about trusting God?
- 8. God answers prayer for our growth, and for His glory. We see this with Paul. Paul's desire was that he might make an impact for Christ on the world and thought by going to Rome that would happen. How did God answer differently from what Paul expected? See Romans 1 and Acts 28:16. What was the result of Paul trusting God and His plan?
