- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1. If we are to look at others with love, we must first acquire love. Discuss ways to acquire genuine love.
- 3. Read Ecclesiastes 3:7 and 8:6. What can be gleaned from the wisdom of Solomon about timing?
- 4. When we feel frustration, fear, or hurt we often respond to others in anger. How can we listen to someone who is angry at us and hear beyond the hurt? Share a time when you were able to do this effectively.
- 5. Using John 12:49, Colossians 4:6 and Proverbs 16:23 as a guide, how will we know the right words and time to speak?
- 6. Read James 1:19. How can we learn to listen first and talk second? What do we gain when we do this?
- 7. Affirming the positive alternative is a powerful way to speak to everyone in our lives. Telling it like it could be, provides hope and encouragement. Identify a situation in your personal or work life where this way of speaking could make a lasting impact.
- 8. When God is able to speak through us to those who need to hear him, our speech is invaluable. Read and discuss these verses in light of that statement: John 12:49. Colossians 4:6, Ephesians 4:29, Proverbs 15:2.
