The Power of Prayer ~7 The prayer you won't want to pray. Jeremiah 8:18, 21

1. For God to burden my heart, I must be

'While Jesus was in Bethany, reclining at the table in the home of Simon the Leper, a woman, came with an alabaster jar of very expensive perfume. She broke the jar and poured the perfume on Jesus' head.'

2. When God burdens my heart, it leads to _

'My grief is beyond healing; my heart is broken... I hurt with the hurt of my people. I mourn and am overcome with grief.' Jeremiah 8:18, 21 NLT

'You've come out to fight me with a sword and a spear and a dagger. But I've come out to fight you in the name of the Lord All-Powerful. He is the God of Israel's army, and you have insulted him too!'

3. When God burdens my heart, give

I was a member of the Pharisees, who demand the strictest obedience to the Jewish law. I was so zealous that I harshly persecuted the church. And as for righteousness, I obeyed the law without fault. I once thought these things were valuable, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done.'

Philippians 3:5-7 NLT

- 7. Read Romans 9:1-3. Have you ever experienced this sort of burden for someone or something else? Describe your experience.
- 8. What truly breaks your heart on behalf of God? What are you going to do about what breaks your heart?
