

## Can you see it? ~4 The danger of familiarity. (Parable of the Great Banquet) Luke 14:1, 7-24

'One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched.' Luke 14:1 NIV

'Then Jesus said to his host, "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or relatives, or your rich neighbours; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

- 3. Before you became a Christian, did you think you were already one? What caused you to have doubts and truly become a Christian?
- 4. Read the Parable of the Great Banquet in Luke 14:15-24.
  - Who would Jesus be referring to as the 'host' of this banquet?
  - Who would Jesus be referring to as the ones making excuses not to attend?
  - Are they sincere excuses?
  - Why would the 'host' be angry?
  - Who are the people now being invited to fill the Master's House?
- 5. Discuss the common excuses people make in putting off salvation.
- 6. As a Christian, how do you respond to someone making these common excuses?
- 7. What does it look like to live a life of invitation? What stops you from inviting people to the party (God's kingdom)?
- 8. What would it look like in our lives each day if we truly did seek first the Kingdom of God?
