The Power of Prayer ~5 How to hear God: Speak, Lord, your servant is listening 1 Samuel 3:1-21

'Suddenly, the LORD called out, "Samuel! Samuel!" "Yes?" Samuel replied. "What is it?" He jumped up and ran to Eli. "Here I am. What do you need?" "I didn't call you," Eli replied. "Go on back to bed." So he did. Then the LORD called out again, "Samuel!" Again Samuel jumped up and ran to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "What do you need?" "I didn't call you, my son," Eli said. "Go on back to bed." Samuel did not yet know the LORD because he had never had a message from the LORD before. So now the LORD called a third time, and once more Samuel jumped up and ran to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "What do you need?" Then Eli realized it was the LORD who was calling the boy. So he said to Samuel, "Go and lie down again, and if someone calls again, say, 'Yes, LORD, your servant is listening.' "So Samuel went back to bed. And the LORD came and called as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel replied, "Yes, your servant is listening." 1 Samuel 3:4-10 NLT

SMALL GROUP SERMON DISCUSSION

- 1. Would you describe yourself as more of a talker or a listener?
- 2. Read 1 Samuel 3:1-21. Why was the word of the Lord rare in those days?
 - What is your own experience of hearing 'the word of the Lord'?
 - What is the connection between the 'word of the Lord being rare' and the detail given to us in v2-3?
 - What do Eli's near-blindness and the dimly burning Temple lamp communicate?
 - v4-10: Samuel was not able to recognise God's voice. If you were advising a new Christian how to hear God, what advice would you give?
 - v11-14: when Samuel does hear the word of the Lord it's pretty heavy stuff! As Samuel reflected on these words later in his life, what effect might they have had on his ministry as a mature man?
 - v15-21: You can understand Samuel's reluctance to share the word from the Lord with Eli (v15). Have there been times when you have had to share something hard with someone? What is the best way to share hard news?
- 3. When was the last time you were completely still before God, listening for His voice?
- 4. In order to hear God's voice, we need to be still, be willing, and be ready. Which of those three things do you think you struggle with most? Why?
- 5. In what ways, when we listen to God, does it help our stress levels?
- 6. Read Psalm 37:7. How might this verse be applied to your life?
- 7. Read Psalm 103:13 and 1 Peter 5:7. How does this aspect of God's character encourage us to listen to Him?
- 8. Read 1 Samuel 3:10. How does what Samuel says here impact you?



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
