

SMALL GROUP SERMON DISCUSSION

- 1. Do your prayers revolve more around what God can do for you or what you can do for God? Give an example of how you'd like to be praying.
- 2. Read Jonah 1:1-3 and Exodus 3:10-11. Discuss these two responses to God's call. List some typical excuses people give for not doing the work God calls them to.
- 3. Read Isaiah 6:1-8. What does holy mean to you?
 - Why would you say that holiness is the most important attribute of God for us sinners to embrace?
 - What effect did this awesome heavenly scene have on Isaiah?
 - In the presence of God is where Isaiah sees the depth of his sinfulness and the sinfulness of Israel. Talk about the power of being in the presence of God, what that looks like and how to experience it.
 - How should a proper contemplation of the holiness of the Lord result in a humble awareness of our sinfulness?
 - Why is such an ongoing awareness both reasonable and necessary to our surrender to God?
 - Isaiah hears the voice of God and responds to the question. How can we learn to hear the voice of God in our daily life?
- 4. Which do you most lack: genuine experience with God, awareness of your sinfulness, or understanding of His grace?
- 5. Talk about the last time you felt compelled to do something out of your norm. How did you respond? Could it have been God sending you?
- 6. Currently, do you most identify with Jonah, Moses, or Isaiah? What might be keeping you from full surrender to God?
