- 4. Read the Parable of the Rich Fool in Luke 12:16-21.

 - What do you think about the rich man's reasoning?
 - Why were the rich man's plans foolish according to God?
 - Is it wrong to be rich?
 - What does it mean to be rich towards God?
- 5. In what ways could someone be coveting something that someone else has, and how will that affect their relationship with that person and with God?
- 6. What treasures has Jesus given us that money cannot buy?
- 7. How do we know if our plans are for God's glory and not our own? How should we respond if God reveals that we have plans for selfish gain?
- 8. How should we be prepared for our own death?
- 9. In what practical ways can we learn the secret of contentment? (Philippians 4:12).
