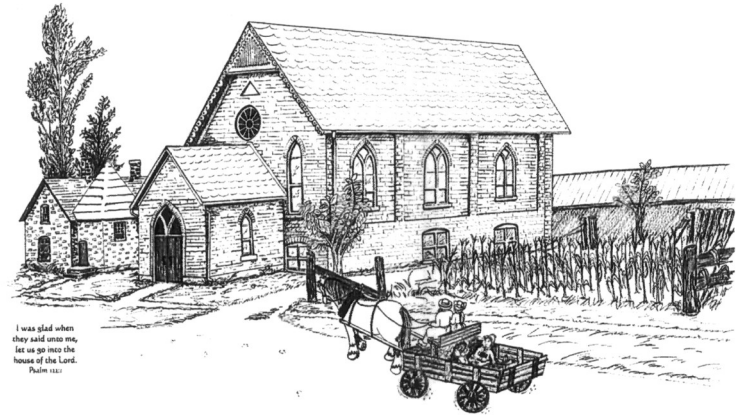


Throughout April SBC will be collecting non-perishable items for the **Corner Cupboard Food Bank** which serves those in need in Aylmer, Malahide, and Bayham. While they greatly appreciate all donations, they currently have an overabundance of a few items and are constantly having to purchase others to fill weekly needs. Please be sure to check expiry dates if you are pulling from your pantry as we cannot offer expired food to our clients as part of their monthly allowance.

- a. The food bank is constantly in need of canned fruit cocktail or peaches (small and large cans), canned vegetables (especially corn, peas, and mixed vegetables), coffee and flour and sugar (we divide large bags into household servings), Kraft dinner, toilet paper, dish soap, laundry soap (we divide into household portions), and diapers (specifically size 4 and 6).
- b. There is an overabundance of canned soups, dry pasta, rice, and cereal in stock at present.
- c. Any financial contribution will go to buy needed items or milk, bread, and eggs. Marcie is on the Board and a weekly volunteer at the Corner Cupboard and is happy to deliver your donation, direct you to etransfer information, or answer your questions about this ministry.
