The Member Spotlight focuses this month on the Holdreads – Dennis and Della. Della, and her cousin Gene Montgomery, hold the unique record of being the last residents who were born at home in Edwardsburg and are still residing in the village. They also are direct descendants of Cannon Smith, early Cass County settler and staunch Methodist for whom historic Smith's Chapel is named.

Della began her education in the first kindergarten class offered by the Edwardsburg schools, graduating 13 years later from Edwardsburg High School. Della tells how she and her siblings —three sisters and one brother — would check in with

neighbors afternoons on the way home from school. Their dad, Mr. Carpenter, was a working carpenter leading to his kids being known as "the nail benders". Denny and Della still live in that neighborhood – less than a block from where she grew up.

Denny's family, including a brother and twin sisters, moved to Edwardsburg from Elkhart in 1963. He became aware of Della when she, as president of their EHS junior class, called a class meeting to order in a definitely authoritarian manner. As high schoolers they experienced working together as part of a group producing their senior play. Their first date included an Elkhart High School concert and an after-concert snack at McDonald's. That was indeed a special treat for Della since that was the first time she had visited a McDonald's restaurant. The couple married in 1967.

Following high school both Denny and Della attended vocational schools – she was in a data processing curriculum, Denny learned the tool and die business. Della's skills led to jobs in area banks, the Selmer music instrument manufacturer and then to the local State Farm Insurance office from which she retired 33 years later. Denny's working life included tool and die shops in Elkhart and South Bend ending at Niles Precision where he retired after 55 years in the industry. What notable working lives – today's average employee stays at a job for 4 years!

Denny and Della are parents of two children, both Edwardsburg High School graduates. They are daughter Jennifer Wyant and son Mark Holdread. Jen retired from her Edwardsburg High School position as social studies teacher in 2022. She lives in South Bend and has two children, Caitlin and Conor, the **5th generation of Carpenter/Holdread EHS grads!** Sadly, Jen's husband Alan passed away in 2014. Mark, wife Stacy and twins Elizabeth and Logan reside in White Hall, Maryland, near Baltimore. Mark works as a business relationship manager for CareFirst-Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Maryland.

After retiring from her career, Della also retired from the Edwardsburg Public Schools Board of Education after 39 years on the Board, 27 years as Board President. She remains active in the community as Vice Chairperson of the Edwardsburg Schools Foundation, Edwardsburg Historical Museum board member, involvement with the annual all-school reunion and member of the Monday Evening Club. Retirement has given Denny more time to pursue his hobbies of antiquing and collecting paper weights. Family gatherings often include competitive games of dominoes or Uno while the couple enjoys a meal out or a once-in-awhile event by a big name entertainer such as Elvis (how did the King exit the building without being seen?) or Bill Cosby.

A life-long member of the local Methodist congregation, following the example of ancestor Cannon Smith, Della has been church treasurer, member of the Pastor-Parish committee and member of United Methodist Women. Congratulations, Denny & Della, on lives well-lived supporting the community and the Hope congregation.




Saturday, May 10 at 11.30AM






