### Three Essential Questions

The following questions are intended to be open-ended and encourage members to consider how they felt and what they, or the group, can do as a result of hearing the message.

1. What did you hear? What point in this message was most impactful for you?
2. What do you think? How did this message challenge, change, or affirm your thinking?
3. What will you do? How will you or your group put into practice what you've learned today?

### Message Points/Extra Questions

1. The message described sexuality as fire—good and powerful when used within God's design, destructive when it isn't. Where do you see this metaphor reflected in culture or personal experience?
2. Read John 8:10—11. What do you notice about how Jesus balances grace and truth in just one sentence? Which part of His response do you personally find easier to receive—grace or truth—and why?
3. Ernest mentioned that sexual sin is uniquely painful and shame-producing. According to 1 Corinthians 6:18, what makes sexual sin different from other sins?
4. Shame often tells people they are their past. How does Jesus' response to this woman redefine her identity and future?
5. Ernest emphasized that freedom requires both receiving grace and walking in the light. Why do you think secrecy gives sexual sin more power?
6. What makes accountability difficult—but necessary?
7. Jesus tells the woman, "Go and leave your life of sin." What might that look like practically today for someone seeking healing and restoration?
