INTRODUCTION

“The Church announces the kingdom of God, it calls men and women to repent of false loyalties, become believers in the one true sovereignty and become a foretaste of the rule of the living God.” – Leslie Newbigin (1909-1998, Theologian and Missionary).

As image bearers, we are called to represent and reflect the nature of God to the world. Our lives (individually and collectively) are to be a foretaste of the rule of God in His eternal Kingdom. Sin has gotten in the way of our ability to fulfill this fundamental call. The Gospel that Jesus invites us into is a new way of living (having been forgiven and justified by His saving work). Jesus’ invitation is for us to become His apprentices in life – learning to live our life in the manner and way in which we were created.

As apprentices to Jesus, there are rhythms and patterns we engage in to see our life increasingly take on His likeness and bear the fruit of the Kingdom. If we desire to have Jesus’ character, it makes sense that we would engage in similar rhythms and practices that we see Him doing.

At Crossroads, our framework of formation is exactly that – practices we engage in to learn to live our life in the manner of Jesus. Of course, there are many practices that help us live as Christ, these are by no means exhaustive. But these have a history of being impactful for the body of Christ to live more fully in a Christlike manner.

Like a garden trellis, the framework allows for support and healthy growth of our soul. As we are formed (and re-formed) into the likeness of Christ, our values, ethics and way of being in the world will gradually be transformed so we can more regularly fulfill the calling to be a foretaste of the heavenly Kingdom.

INTRODUCTION CONTINUED

In this series, we are seeking to better understand each practice and its place within the formation life of our church.

While we cannot (nor should we) try to engage in all these practices at one time, these are all helpful in deepening our life with God. You may find yourself in a season where one or more of these practices are not feasible. That is OK. The point is not to get spiritual brownie points for checking more boxes. Rather, pay attention to how and where the Lord leads you in your formation into Christlikeness.

As we move our way through these practices, ask the Holy Spirit where He may want to lead you. As you sense a nudge towards a specific practice, talk with a trusted spiritual friend (or make an appointment to talk with me) and sort out how you might begin being more intentional in your growth.

SPIRITUAL PRACTICE: LOVE GOD; LOVE NEIGHBOR

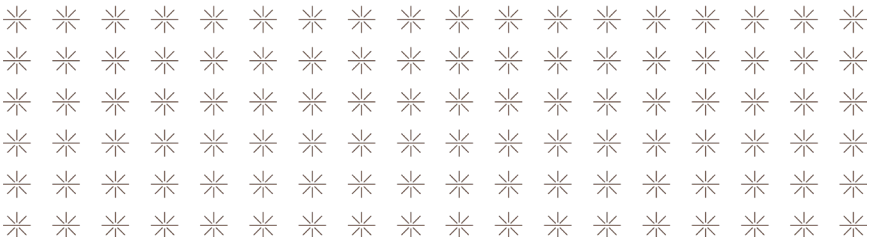
Jesus was asked once what was the most important commandment. He summarized them all with: **“you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength ... and the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself.”**

The word ‘love’ in this passage is agape – it is the highest form of unconditional love that desires the best and honor for the object of the love. To love God and neighbor with that kind of love is to be actively working for their benefit and honor.

During this series, devote an hour each week to love God and an hour to love neighbor.

Example: for your hour of intentional loving God, attend services each week with an intention to engage and honor God with your heart, soul, mind and strength. How can my heart (emotions) be engaged in honoring and devotion to God during the service? Seek to bring your whole self into the worship space.

For your hour of intentionally loving neighbor, ask the Lord how you might demonstrate His love towards someone. As He brings someone to mind, courageously step towards that person in an act of love. It does not need to be drastic or earth-shattering (probably best if it is not) only an intentional act to remind the other of their status as a beloved image bearer of God.





EASTERTIDE:

50 DAYS OF CELEBRATION

Lent is the 40 days of fasting and prayer reminding us of our desperate need for a savior. Easter is the day we let loose in celebration for our savior is risen! The celebration of resurrection is not to be overshadowed by the long period of fasting. While fasting and lament is a significant part of our life, it is not to have the final word. Resurrection means that the worst thing is never the final thing!

Thus, many Christian traditions celebrate 50 Days of Easter! Easter is more than an event to be celebrated at one service each year – but a way of living as resurrection people. It is 50 days for at least two reasons: first because it correlates with the days after Easter until Pentecost (the sending of the Holy Spirit and commissioning of the early church) and because it is to be longer than the fasting season of Lent.

We want to invite you to a weekly time of celebration during Eastertide. Have fun with this (with family/friends): put out decorations, have a special meal, put an extra plate on the table for Jesus, make ice cream sundaes, roast marshmallows over the fire, have a dance party, read the resurrection story. The point is to find something to do at least once a week that will remind you of the new life in Christ.

Much like we do for Advent/Christmas (decorate/retell the story of Jesus' birth), find ways to retell and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus each week. Eastertide officially ends on Pentecost Sunday – May 24, 2026.



EASTERTIDE:

IDEAS

- **Resurrection Rolls:** Resurrection rolls are a great Easter recipe that you can make with the kids. Cinnamon-coated marshmallows are wrapped in dough, then baked. When you break them open, they are empty inside, representing Jesus's tomb on Easter morning.

Ingredients: crescent rolls, 2 tablespoons white sugar, 2 tablespoons ground cinnamon, 8 large marshmallows, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup melted butter.

Step 1: Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Lightly grease baking sheet

Step 2: separate crescent rolls into triangles

Step 3: mix sugar and cinnamon in a bowl

Step 4: dip marshmallows into melted butter, roll in sugar mixture. Place marshmallow in the center of the dough triangle, carefully wrap dough around marshmallow. Pinch the seams together. Place roll on baking sheet.

Step 5: bake rolls in preheated oven until golden brown (15 minutes)



AND MORE IDEAS:

- **Watercolor Resurrection**
Using watercolors, paint a small picture of the joy of Resurrection Sunday
- **Resurrection Sunrise**
Intentionally get up before the sunrise (likely before 6am). Get a cup of coffee (or tea) and sit outside as you watch the sunrise. Take in the beauty of a new day and be reminded that this is the power of resurrection.
- **Resurrection Wildflowers**
Plant a set of wildflowers in a flowerpot and watch them as new life buds from the ground.
- **Homemade Pie/Ice Cream**
Read the resurrection story in Luke 24 each week. Ask each family member to highlight something they think is unique/interesting in the way the story is told
- **Backyard Camping/Build a fort in the house**
While it may not be 'resurrection specific' it's a fun way to explore life and laugh. Because Jesus is alive, we have reason for joy and celebration :)
- **Fancy Dinner**
Consider getting dressed 'extra special' for a meal with your good dishes. Be sure to set a space in honor of Jesus! Make one of your favorite dishes and spend time talking about who you would like to talk with in Heaven.

The idea here is to be as creative as you can - have fun and celebrate ... Jesus is Risen!

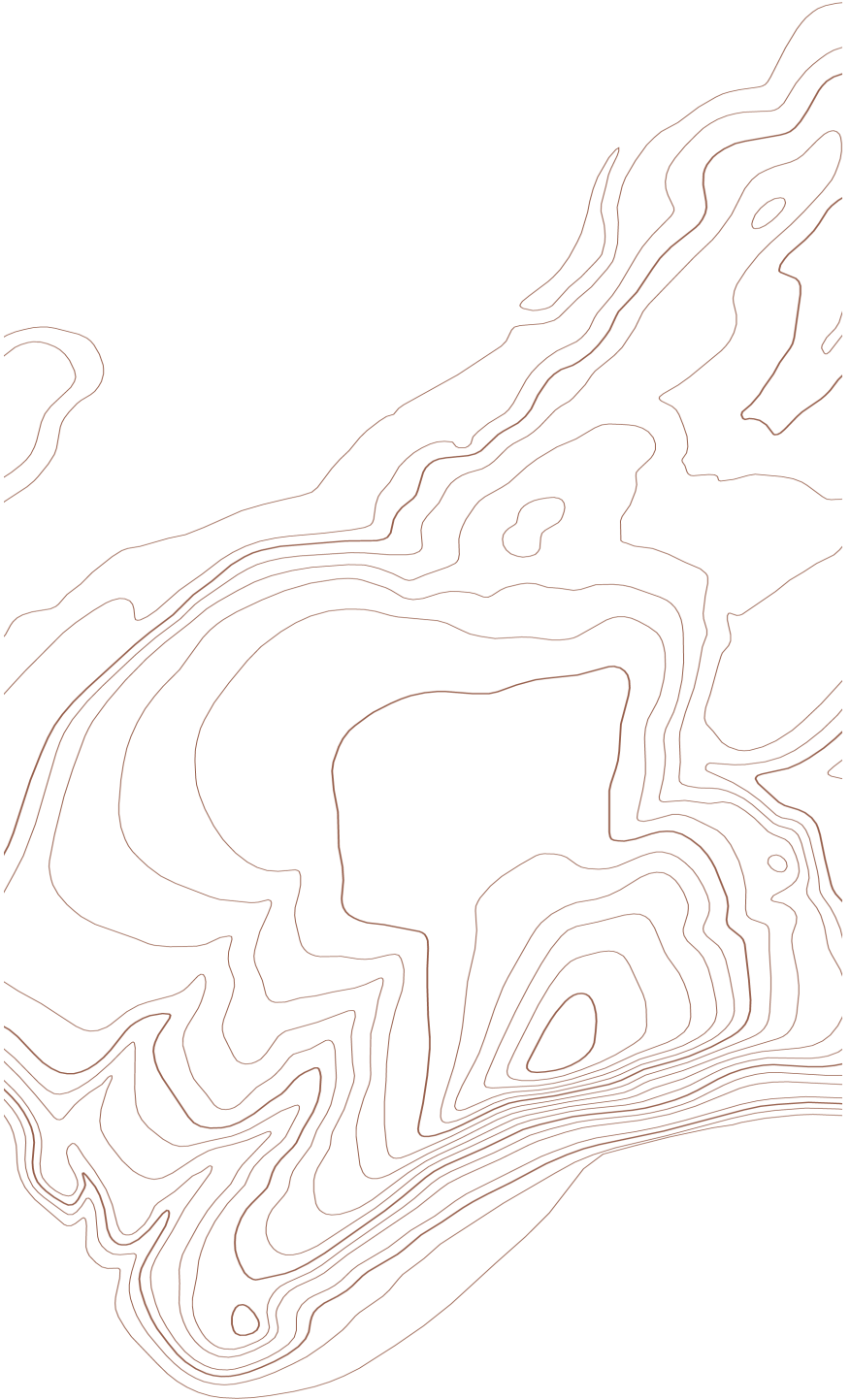


