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INTRODUCTION:

We are told in 1 Thessalonians 5:18 to give thanks in all circumstances. It is easy to feel and express gratitude when things are going well, but what about those times when things are not? With so many tragic things happening, it can be easy to lose sight of the goodness of God.

As Apprentices to Jesus, we are learning to live with His perspective on all things. Gratitude is a characteristic of someone who sees their life in light of eternity and the good things God has done (and is doing). That is not to say that gratitude is automatic. We grow in our capacity for gratitude as we come to see God as the giver of all things – in "Him we live and move and have our being."

Thomas Merton once said, "to be grateful is to recognize the love of God in everything. Every breath we draw is a gift of His love. Every moment of our existence is a gift of His grace. Gratitude takes nothing for granted. It is never unresponsive. The grateful person knows that God is good not by hearsay, but by personal experience."

In this series, we are inviting one another to experience the goodness of God in everyday ways.

Spend some time this month seeking to find ways to express gratitude and you will find yourself growing in capacity to love others and lay aside contempt. A heart of gratitude is a better way of living.



SPIRITUAL PRACTICE: GRATITUDE SCAVENGER HUNT

Our life with God is more than a religious duty once a week, it entails our whole life. Likewise, a heart of gratitude is not meant to be relegated to the season of 'thanksgiving' but to be a part of a life surrendered to a good and beautiful God. We encourage you to be on a 'scavenger-hunt' throughout the week of things for which you can be grateful. Be fun and creative!

Items to be looking for:

- good conversation with a friend
- wake up early to watch the sunrise
- stretch as far as you can give God thanks for your movement
- as you eat a meal, consider the people who have contributed to your food (farmer, processor, delivery, grocery store, clerk, etc.)
- a red light, grateful for the pause in your day
- have a hot drink (coffee, tea, hot chocolate)
- take a walk around your house notice all the conveniences you have
- review your life with God, say a prayer of gratitude for forgiveness offered through Jesus
- as you go into work, be grateful for the opportunity you have before you
- write a note to someone letting them know you are thankful for them
