

INTRODUCTION:

Advent is a season of anticipation. As Christians, the season is more than the decorations, meals, gifts and traditions. It is a season to specifically retell the story of the birth of Christ. The Christ child was no ordinary child. Jesus is the eternal Second Person of the Trinity – fully Divine yet fully human. It is a mystery we will never fully understand.

His birth is the fulfillment of prophesy and God's plan to rescue lost humanity and restore us to our original intent. We celebrate His birth because at it a Light has come that the "darkness has not overcome" (John 1:5).

Light is a good metaphor for the work of Jesus. Without the love of God, we are lost in complete darkness. A number of years ago, Jeanna and I did some cave exploring. It was exciting and thrilling to be hundreds of feet below the surface with only our headlamps as light.

At one point, our guide had us all turn off our lamps – total darkness! We could not see our hands inches away from our face! Then one light made a tremendous difference – it changed our experience of the surroundings. I am not sure if you have ever been in utter darkness like that before, but you can imagine the bleakness of darkness.

That is us apart from life with God – stumbling around without a sense of direction. Which is why the coming of Jesus marks a change in everything. Suddenly there is a Light that guides, directs, rescues, and restores. Jesus, the Light, has come that we may have life and have it to the full.

INTRODUCTION CONTINUED:

We, of course, must receive and stay close to the Light. For if we choose to navigate life without Him, it is like being hundreds of feet below the surface with no sense of direction – not a good option.

During the Advent season, with all the decorations, dinners, gatherings, songs and gifts, we celebrate the gift of God's love for us to descend into humanity in order to bring Light into our darkness!

We invite you to weekly pray the Scripture. Praying Scripture is using the words of the Bible to inform/ shape our prayers. When we slow down to meditate on the words of Scripture it keeps us grounded in the heart of God and keeps our eyes on that which is true and praiseworthy. We can sometimes get 'stuck' in our prayers and they become more like mindless repetition rather than communing with the Almighty God.

When we use the words of Scripture, it not only shapes our words but focuses us on God's heart for others. In this way, prayer can serve as transformative both for the situation before us as well as within us.

Here's how we can Pray the Scripture:

Request: Quietly ask God to guide your thoughts and impressions by the Holy Spirit as you come into your time of prayer.

Read: Read the passage all the way through. Pay particular attention on thoughts/phrases that stand out to you. Get the overall picture of the passage and what is being said.

Reflect: Before moving too quickly, reflect on the impressions and what you are gleaning from your reading. What moves you about the heart of God? What do you notice about humanity's response to God?

Use the words to pray: Use the words of Scripture to inspire your prayer/request. Do not rush past this. Look for ways the passage encourages you to worship God for who He is; confess your sins; pray for the needs of yourself and/or others.

SPIRITUAL PRACTICE CONTINUED:

For this Advent Season, we are using John 1:1-14. Carve out some time (5-10 minutes) each week to spend praying. You will find the passage and a place to write/journal your thoughts.

In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

YEAR-END OFFERING

Each year, we prayerfully consider what ministry initiatives we would like to make a significant investment through a 'year-end offering'. This is an above-and-beyond offering that will go towards a special project.

Our goal is **\$80,000**. It will take all of us prayerfully and sacrificially giving in order to meet/exceed our goal. Our year-end offering will be split in Tithe and 3 Emphasises:

Tithe: 10% (\$8,000):

Food bank support (West Ohio Food Bank) to support families/individuals in times of need.

Emphasis #1:

Kitchen Upgrade (\$34,000), Commercial oven/stove, cabinets, flooring, repairs and paint. To be completed: February 2026

Emphasis #2:

Cafe Update (\$8,000), 1.5 gal coffee carafes, instant hot water, electrical and water needs. To be completed: March 2026

Emphasis #3:

Continued building needs (\$30,000), "Punchlist of items" close to \$200,000. Payment plans and other financial resolutions. To be completed 2026.

While you can give to the 'year-end offering' at any time, we are targeting Sunday, December 21st, 2025, as the specific Sunday. We are asking each of us to prayerfully consider participating in this year-end offering.


