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INTRODUCING JONAH:

The story of Jonah is one of the most well-known stories in the Older Testament, probably because of Jonah being swallowed by a giant fish.

No doubt, some will dismiss this story because it tells us that Jonah was swallowed by a giant fish. How you answer this will determine how else you read the Bible. As followers of Christ, who believe in the incarnation, death and resurrection of the Second Person of the Trinity (a far greater miracle), there is nothing difficult in reading the story of Jonah.

Additionally, the author does not capitalize on the miraculous event in order to capture attention – like you would assume. The mention of the giant fish is only two brief verses with no added descriptive words. *Let's not get distracted by the fish*!

The book of Jonah is only four chapters long and is the story of a prophet who does not want to obey the word of God that he receives. Other books of prophets center on the message of the prophet. This book, however, centers on the character of the prophet himself.

And it presents a number of options to discuss and dive into:

- a.) It is about race and nationalism. Jonah seems more concerned with his nation's military security over a city of spiritually lost people.
- b.) It is also about God's call for missions to share the news about him to the world.
- c.) It is also about the struggles everyday believers have in obeying the word of God.

While the story is short, there are layers of meaning that applies to much of human life. In the short weeks we have to dive into the story, we will only be scratching the surface. Therefore, the questions and resources here are for you to explore some of these layers/implications.

"The book of Jonah yields many insights about God's love for societies and people beyond the community of believers; about his opposition to toxic nationalism and disdain for other races; and about how to be "in mission" in the world despite the subtle and unavoidable power of idolatry in our own lives and hearts. Grasping these insights can make us bridge builders, peacemakers, and agents of reconciliation in the world." (Timothy Keller, Rediscovering Jonah)

The question that Jonah wrestles with is: how can God be merciful and forgive people who have done such violence and evil? It is not answered in the story of Jonah. But taken within the context of the whole of Scripture, we are invited to look forward to how God saved the world through the one who called himself the 'ultimate Jonah' (Matthew 12:41) so that he could be both just and justifier of those who believe (Romans 3:26).

As we encounter Jonah's story together, reflect on your own willingness to see the mercy and love of God as demonstrated in Christ. How does this compassion shape and mold you to be Christ-like? Where do we need to heed the warnings of nationalism and isolationism that we see in Jonah?



Immersive reading involves hearing a story and imagining yourself as present in the story. The point is to move from gathering information about the story to connecting with God through the story. 
