Journey to A With-God Life

INTRODUCTION:

(From Richard Foster's Prayer): "Perhaps you have never prayed before except in anguish or terror. It may be that the only time the Divine Name has been on your lips has been in angry expletives.

Never mind... the Father's heart is open wide - you are welcome to come in.

Perhaps you do not believe in prayer. You may have tried to pray and were profoundly disappointed... It does not matter. The Father's heart is open wide - you are welcome to come in.

Perhaps you are bruised and broken by the pressures of life. Others have wronged you, and you feel scarred for life. You have old, painful memories that have never been healed. You avoid prayer because you feel too distant and unworthy. Do not despair. The Father's heart is open wide - you are welcome to come in.

Perhaps you have prayed for years, but the words have grown brittle and cold. Little ever happens anymore. God seems remote and inaccessible. Listen to me. The Father's heart is open wide - you are welcome to come in.

Perhaps prayer is the delight of your life. You can attest to its goodness. But you long for more: more power, more love, more of God in your life. Believe me. The Father's heart is open wide - you too are welcome to come higher up and deeper in."

What an introduction to a life of prayer! A life where we learn, by experience, to abide in the presence of God in such a way that we gain strength and depth in our understanding of grace.

INTRODUCTION CONTINUED:

A life of prayer is something we grow in through experience. While we can talk about it, we are invited to practice. More than trying to have a 'prayer life', we are invited to have a praying life. Paul says we are to learn to pray without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18). That is, to live our life with a constant awareness of the goodness of God around us that we are in constant communion with Him.

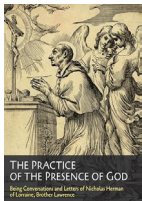

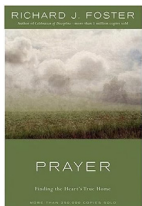
RESOURCES: QUESTIONS AND EXPERIMENTS

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

Week 1: Simple Prayer

Genesis 15:1-16, 17:15-22, 18:1-15

Reflection:

What are you most likely to have conversations with God about? What would you like to discuss with God?

Question for study:

1. How would you describe the interaction between God and Abraham?
2. Why do you think Abraham felt freedom to ask the almighty God any question at all?
3. If you were in a prayer conversation with God, and God said, “know for certain that...”, how might God finish that sentence? That is, what do you believe God has been trying to help you know “for certain” lately?
4. It’s been said that humans think they are ‘in charge’ of their prayer, relegating certain time and topics. Conversing with God means the Holy Spirit leads you, and you are no longer ‘in charge’ of your prayer. In what ways are you tempted to be ‘in charge’ of your prayers?
5. The premier mark of Abraham was his complete confidence in God. How might his conversations with God have developed such faith?

Experiment:

- Take a walk and try to think of all the questions you would like to ask God.
- Read the back-and-forth conversation in Genesis 18:20-33 and ponder why God engaged Abraham in conversation this way. Journal about whether you believe God is really interested in your ideas.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

Week 2: Formational Prayer

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Reflection:

In what ordinary situations, unrelated to church or devotional life, have thoughts of God come to you?

Question for study:

1. Which of the three activities listed in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 comes most easily to you?
2. How might practicing an awareness of God's presence help us become more full of love, courage, purity or humility?
3. In what ways do gratitude and thanksgiving aid in a life of prayer?
4. Do you find yourself more of a half-empty or half-full kind of person?

Experiment:

- Take a walk for at least 15 minutes. Take care to experience everything around you. Touch plants, notice the shades of color, take in the air and notice how it changes as you walk. Use all five senses as much as you can. How are you reminded of the presence of God with you always?
- Before getting out of bed in the morning, greet God with an image of him swooping down to rescue you (Psalm 18:4-19) or singing over you (Zephaniah 3:17). Before going to sleep, review your day and ask, where did I most sense God's presence?
- Choose two or three songs that you could hum to help you practice God's presence.

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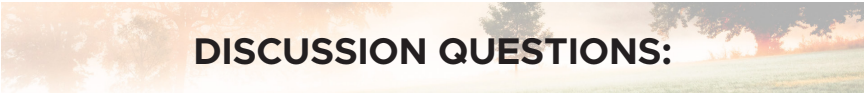


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How are you listening to God in prayer?

Week 3: Listening to God in Prayer

1 Chronicles 14:8-17

Reflection:

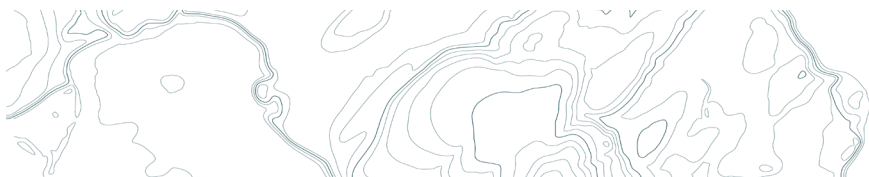
Have you ever had a sense of God ‘nudging’ you to do something – step out and help someone, stand up to a bully, make peace with a bully?

Question for study:

1. 1 Chronicles 14:8-17. From what you know about David, why would he have been the sort of person who asked God questions and expected real answers?
2. What are some reasons that make “inquiring of the Lord” perhaps the last thing it would occur to us to do?
3. Interesting that David did not rely on God’s previous answer but inquired again. When we rely on previous answers, or answers others have experienced, what assumptions do we make?
4. Why is it sometimes difficult to follow through and do what God leads you to do?

Experiment:

- Sit quietly and ask God about a certain dilemma. Write down what you hear. If God gives you direction, resolve to follow it even if it seems strange or uncomfortable.
- Read Psalm 81 and notice the three times the word listen appears. What are the benefits received by the person who listens to God?

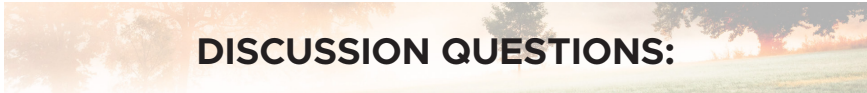

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

Week 4: Prayer of Request

Matthew 6:9-13

Reflection:

What have been your most frequent prayers of request in the course of your life?

Question for study:

1. As you read the Lord's Prayer slowly, are there any particular phrases that stand out to you more than the other phrases?
2. If you were to pray that God's kingdom would come (people would do God's will so that love and justice, mercy and truth would be the normal state of things), what specific circumstances would come to your mind to pray about?
3. What does God's forgiveness of us have to do with our forgiveness of others?
4. How do the requests in the Lord's Prayer work toward the transformation of our souls?

Experiment:

- Try praying this paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer, which makes the requests in it stand out. Underline the request that is most significant for you today.

Dear Father always near us, may your name be treasured and loved, may your rule be completed in us – may your will be done here on earth in just the way it is done in heaven. Give us today the things we need today, and forgive us our sins and impositions on you as we are forgiving all who in any way offend us. Please don't put us through trials, but deliver us from everything bad. Because you are the one in charge, and you have all the power, and the glory too is all yours – forever – which is just the way we want it.
