Background Information:

This letter was written by Paul from prison to the church in Colosse, which was about 100 miles east of Ephesus. Although he never personally visited this church, it was likely established as a result of his ministry in Ephesus. Paul was visited by a native of Colosse while in prison, a man named Epaphras who is thought to have founded the church there. Epaphras gave the apostle a full report

of a growing situation in his church which prompted Paul's letter. It seemed that the church had fallen under the influence of false teachings, disguised as enlightened philosophy, and claimed to be a higher, more spiritual form of Christianity. Paul writes to counterattack this blending of Greek philosophy, cultic practices, Christianity and Jewish speculations and assures his audience of the full adequacy of Christ Jesus. He assures them that Christ is supreme over all things, including the powers of evil that were seen to threaten human life. As the preeminent source in every sphere, and as all-sufficient for the believer's needs, Jesus is presented as the true Lord of the universe. Paul also highlights love, thankfulness and forgiveness as the marks of true spirituality and includes a brief wealth of practical instruction for Christian living.
