# What is a budget?

Let's start with a definition...

Budgeting is an **operational plan**, for a **defined period** (usually a year), expressed in financial terms and based on the **expected income** and **expenditure**.

# Why do we budget?

- It helps us keep our eyes on the mission/vision
- It helps ensure we don't spend money we don't have / stay out of debt
- It helps us save money / prepare for emergencies
- It is a requirement of our by-laws



# Prerequisites of Budgeting

- **Plans** – have a plan for the coming year. What are your objectives? How are you planning on achieving those objectives?
- **Financial data** – historical data on revenue and expenditures related to your area of accountability
- **Budget Process & Procedures** – what forms need to be completed? When are they due? How is the budget created and approved.

# Principles of Budgeting

- Pray
- Start by focussing on the objectives of the ministry
- Plan your Ministry activities well in advance based on objectives
- Seek council from others
- Budget according to vision, but don't forget the past or present
- Build in margin and flexibility

# Two common types of Budgets

- **Incremental Budget** – Incremental budgeting takes last year’s actual figures and adds or subtracts a percentage to obtain the current year’s budget.
- **Zero Base Budget** – all line items in the budget are zero and must be rebuilt from scratch. People must be able to justify each expense. No expenditures are automatically “okayed”.

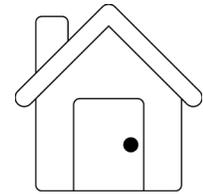

### Too low level

- The budget doesn't need to include items with such small amounts
- It may be helpful to build your budget this way then summarize them into logical units

# What makes a good budget submission (2 of 4)?

- Use good descriptions under “Item” and if it’s not clear add notes.



Ask yourself, “Is it clear to the leaders who will be approving the budget what the item is for?”

An extreme example to make the point

Example of a good description with notes

- Make sure the item(s) you’re budgeting should be included in your line vs. another line

This item should be included under Custodial supplies vs. Children’s Ministries

# What makes a good budget submission (3 of 4)?

- Include single items over \$1,500 in the replacement reserve budget

This is a valid item that is required for ministry, but it should be included in the Replacement reserve budget, not the operating budget.

- Provide your budget submission on or ahead of time

# What makes a good budget submission (4 of 4)?

- If there is an unusual request, it's helpful to know how it relates back to our mission. Feel free to add a **brief** paragraph outlining this.

Here's an example.

We are planning to give away gold fish to the community to bring them in to the church and introduce them to our ministry to youth

- **For staff:** Review your budget submission with your manager / ensure you have their support prior to submitting the budget

# FAQs

## **Q1: What happens if I miss something in my budget submission and need additional funds in 2024?**

**A1:** It depends. Based on our bylaws:

- a) if the amount is for less than 0.5% of the budget, the elders or deacons can approve the request without it going to the congregation for approval
- b) If the amount is greater than 0.5% of the budget, the church membership must approve it at a members meeting

## **Q2: What happens if I spend more than I've budgeted for?**

**A2:** According to our bylaws, you are not allowed to spend more than what was approved for each major line item(s)

## **Q3: I don't know how to use a spreadsheet. What do I do?**

**A3:** We use a spreadsheet to simplify the calculations. If you don't know how to use a spreadsheet:

- 1) Ask a team member for help
- 2) Use whatever form of communication you're comfortable with (email, Word, etc.)
