## CR Women - Study Schedule (for Study of Mark)

This schedule is based on our current 2 week study cycle. Since we value Sabbath, we've organized it based on 10 days out of 14 as "study days," but you can modify it to your preferred study schedule.

If you find yourself struggling with "when" to finish "what," perhaps seeing this progression will help. This assumes you spend roughly 15-20mins a day, or 1 hour 15mins a week on your independent study. If you spend more, you will either be finished quicker or have time to linger and go deeper in each part of the process. You will soon discover that different parts of the process go quicker for you than others. That will also help you know how to adjust your study schedule.

Hope it's helpful!

Day 1	Pray! Establish Context(Remember your BRI), Read Passage 1: marking observations in the text as you go & looking up any needed definitions.
Day 2	Pray! Remember your Context(what came before and your BRI info), Read Passage 2: marking observations in the text as you go & looking up any needed definitions.
Day 3	Pray! Remember your Context(what came before and your BRI info), Read Passage 3: marking observations in the text as you go & looking up any needed definitions.
Day 4	Pray! Go back through all 3 passages wherever you marked the text (your Bible or ESV Journal) and choose 3-5 key observations that stand out to you as really important from each of the 3 passages. Write them into your Chart. (explanation is at the bottom of pg. 13 for Study 2) Do the "Interpret the Text" section (top of pg. 17) for each of your key observations; using the interpretive questions given to form your thinking.
Day 5	Pray! Do "Theme Tracing" (pg. 17) skimming back through the passages.
Day 6	Pray! Title/Summarize each passage and begin "Some Helpful Questions"
Day 7	Pray! Then finish "Some Helpful Questions"
Day 8	Pray! Spend this day working through the Application section, answering the questions given.
Day 9	Pray! Spend time on the Further Reflection section.
Day 10	Write out a prayer to God based on your applications, your new understanding of God's character and your own, the questions you have.
