1. Read Genesis 45:16-46:27. What stood out or encouraged you from this week's passage and message?

## **God's Provision**

- 2. Read Matthew 7:7-11; Ephesians 3:20-21 and Philippians 4:19-20. How should these passages, along with our passage in Genesis, shape our understanding of God's ability to provide for His people?
- 3. Jacob asked for grain but received far more—the best of the land, restoration among his family and reunion with Joseph. Do you have any of your own stories of God answering your prayers in an exceedingly, abundant way?

## **God's Promises**

- 4. God promised His presence "I myself will go down with you." How does God's promise to be with you affect the way you handle uncertainty or fear?
- 5. Jacob's story points forward to the resurrection hope. How does the promise of resurrection reshape the way you view death, loss, or suffering?

## 3. God's People

- 6. The list of names in Genesis 46 shows God's faithfulness in growing His people from a family into a nation. What does this passage teach us about small beginnings and God's long-term plans?
- 7. God's purpose was to bless *all nations* through His people. What are some ways our church family can reflect that mission today?
- 8. How does the parable of the mustard seed (Matthew 13:31–32) encourage you about the growth of God's kingdom—both globally and in your own life?
