

Community Group Questions (Isaiah 12:1-6)

1. Read Isaiah 12:1-6. What did you find most interesting, helpful or encouraging from this week's passage and message?
2. What is a song (worship song or other) that has been meaningful to you during a season of life? Why?
3. We looked at several examples throughout Scripture where God's people respond to His deliverance with singing. Why do you think singing is such a common response to God's saving work?
4. In verses 2-3, Isaiah describes God as "my strength," "my song," and "my salvation." Which of those descriptions stands out most to you right now? Why?
5. Many Christians think of their testimony only as something that happened in the past. How have you seen God sustaining, strengthening, or refreshing you in your current season of life?
6. Isaiah says, "I will trust and will not be afraid." What fears are most common in our culture right now? How does the gospel speak to those fears?
7. The focus of the passage shifts from an individual ("you") in verses 1 and 2 to a community ("you all") in verses 4-6. Why is it important for Christians to worship and testify together rather than only privately?
8. The message emphasized that our song is not only directed toward God but also heard by others. How have you been encouraged, challenged, or influenced by another believer's worship or testimony?
9. If Isaiah 12 teaches that "we've been saved to sing," what is one specific reason you have to sing God's praise this week?
