

*PSALM 138*  
*COMMUNITY GROUP QUESTIONS*

1. Read Psalm 138. What did you find helpful or encouraging from this week's passage and message?
2. We are "constantly experiencing" God's steadfast love, whether we notice it or not. Where have you seen God's steadfast love or faithfulness recently, even in small or ordinary ways?
3. When you become aware of God's goodness, what does your worship actually look like—both privately and when the church gathers? In what ways might God be inviting you into more "whole-hearted" praise?
4. David praises God "before the gods" (in front of idols, rulers, and a watching world). Where do you feel most tempted to tone down or hide your allegiance to Jesus, and why?
5. When thinking about our loud celebration at sporting events (or concerts/similar activities) with our often "muted" worship. What keeps us more expressive about temporary wins than about eternal realities? How might that begin to change in your life?
6. "On the day I called, you answered me; my strength of soul you increased" (v.3). Can you share a time when God did not remove a trial, but strengthened you to endure it? How did that shape your view of Him?
7. The sermon emphasized that praise is "evangelistic and contagious." What are some natural, non-awkward ways you could begin weaving "God language" (giving Him credit) into your normal conversations this week?
8. David can say, "The Lord will fulfill his purpose for me" even while walking "in the midst of trouble." Where in your life right now do you most need to rest in that truth? What makes trusting His purposes hard for you?
9. Thinking about children, newer believers, or spiritually curious friends who are watching your life: what picture of God's goodness and faithfulness are they likely picking up from you? Is there anything you'd like to grow in so that your example points more clearly to Him?
