

## II TIMOTHY 3:10-17

<sup>10</sup>But you have followed my teaching, conduct, purpose, faith, patience, love, and endurance, <sup>11</sup>along with the persecutions and sufferings that came to me in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra. What persecutions I endured — and yet the Lord rescued me from them all. <sup>12</sup>In fact, all who want to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted. <sup>13</sup>Evil people and impostors will become worse, deceiving and being deceived. <sup>14</sup>But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed. You know those who taught you, <sup>15</sup>and you know that from infancy you have known the sacred Scriptures, which are able to give you wisdom for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. <sup>16</sup>All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness, <sup>17</sup>so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.
