There were many ways Saul tried to make David look bad. But David always came out on top with his wisdom and faith brought him through. Even though Saul and David didn't get along well, David formed a strong bond of love with Saul's son, Jonathan. Jonathan repeatedly helped David and protected his life.

In 2 Samuel 1-7, David becomes King over all of Israel. He conquered Jerusalem and made it the capital and promised that his descendants would build a temple and establish an eternal kingdom. King David also moved the Ark of the Covenant, the symbol of God's presence, into Jerusalem.
