Growing Notes

What are examples from our current culture that demonstrate an obsession with self? Why is it so difficult to resist these trends? How do you avoid them?

Take time to read together Matthew 5:23-24; Matthew 18:15-20; Galatians 6:1-5. How are these passages helpful regarding our motives and actions when dealing with our own sin and sin in others?

Like those in the Corinthian church, some within Christianity think that sin is not that big of a deal because we are already forgiven. How does Galatians 6:7-10 help us stay away from this incorrect thinking?

Consider the "buckets" of Intimacy with God, Community with Insiders, and Influence with Outsiders:

- Which bucket is currently your greatest challenge to consistently fill?
- How can you tangibly contribute to each bucket this week?
- How can the group support you and pray for you?

Don't Tolerate the Toxic

(1 Corinthians 5)

The citizens of 1st century Corinth lived in a culture obsessed with self. Believers in the church at Corinth took their cues from that culture and failed to fully recognize their identity in Jesus. As they struggled with abandoning their lifestyle prior to following Jesus, serious sins were left unchecked within the gathering. What happens when a church doesn't live out what they say they believe and fail to view every area of life through the lens of the Gospel?

Themes in 1 Corinthians:

- Divisions (1-4)
- Sexuality (5-7)
- Food & Freedom (8-10)
- Worship gatherings (11-14)
- Resurrection (15)

The issue: Some in the church were participating in <u>sexual</u> immorality (Gr: *porneia*)

The real issue: The church's arrogant response

Paul's Gospel response:

- The church's mistake when dealing with internal sin is lack of humility and accountability
- The church's role when dealing with internal sin should be repentance, not rationalization
- The church's goal when dealing with internal sin should be restoration, not punishment
- The church's practice when interacting with unbelievers should be involvement, not judgement
