It does not insist on its own way \rightarrow I will practice flexibility and consider others' need before my own.

It is not irritable or resentful \rightarrow I will stay calm in frustration and let go of past offenses.

It does not rejoice at wrongdoing \rightarrow I will not find pleasure in others' mistakes but will encourage what is right and good.

It rejoices with the truth \rightarrow I will celebrate honesty and truth even when it's hard to hear.

Love bears, believes, hopes, and endures all things \rightarrow I will remain faithful and hopeful even in hard times.

Love never ends \rightarrow I will keep showing love no matter the season or circumstance.

HOW CAN WE BECOME LOVE (vv.8b-13)

Love is not just a command — Love is <u>a person</u>. vv4-8a
Love lasts because Christ is <u>forever</u>. vv8b-10
Maturity comes when Christ moves us beyond <u>ourselves</u>. v11
We become love by meeting the One who <u>knows/loves</u> us fully. v12
To abide in love is to <u>abide</u> in Christ. v13; John 15:9

Growing Notes

<u>Icebreaker:</u> What's the most common way people "flex" in our culture (on social media, at work, in relationships)? Have you ever caught yourself flexing something — trying to impress others?

What Love Isn't (vv1-3). Why does Paul say that without love, what we speak, know, do, or give means nothing? How do you recognize when your motives are loving (pleasing God) versus self-seeking (appeasing God)?

What Love Is (vv4-8a). Which description of love stands out most to you — and why? Where is it hardest for you personally to live out this kind of love (family, work, friendships, church)? What is the difference between charisma vs. character? What are the dangers of mistaking these two?

How Can We Become Love (vv.8b-13). What does it mean that love is not just a command but a Person? How does Christ's love for us help us grow in love? True change must happen on the level of habit (character). Spiritual disciplines don't transform our habits but put us in touch with the One who does. Explain. What are some things you can begin to do to grow in your experience of God's love for you? Pray.

PERFECT GOD

"Love is The Real Flex" (1Cor.13)

We live in a culture that loves to flex. But here's the truth: the greatest flex in life isn't power, money, or talent — it's love.

That's exactly what Paul is saying in 1 Corinthians 13. In a church full of people flexing their spiritual gifts — eloquent speaking, Biblical insight, mountain moving faith, sacrificial living — Paul cuts through all the noise and says: "You can have all the gifts, all the knowledge, all the success, but without love, it means nothing. So, let's walk through this chapter and see why love is the real flex.

WHAT LOVE ISN'T (vv.1-3)

It Isn't How Well You <u>speak</u>. v1
It Isn't How Much You <u>know</u>. v2a
It Isn't How Much You <u>do</u>. v2b
It Isn't How Much You <u>give</u> v3

A Gospel transformed life is not a morally restrained will motivated by fear and/or pride (self-centeredness), but a supernaturally transformed heart motivated by **love** (God-centeredness).

Our approach to God is not to <u>appease</u> Him but to <u>Please</u> Him.

<u>Appease</u>: I obey God to get His Approval/Blessing (Religion). <u>Please</u>: I have His Approval/Blessing in Christ therefore I obey Him joyfully (Gospel).

WHAT LOVE IS (vv.4-8a)

"True character is revealed in the choices a person makes under pressure—the greater the pressure, the deeper the revelation, the truer the choice to the character's essential nature...As he chooses, he is." John Ortberg (Steps)

Love is patient and kind \rightarrow I will choose to wait calmly and treat others with gentleness.

Love does not envy or boast \rightarrow I will celebrate others' successes instead of comparing or bragging.

It is not arrogant or rude \rightarrow I will respect others with humility and kindness in my words and actions.
