

The Fruit of Integrity – Living Honestly Before God and Others (v11–13)

What does God want from you more than anything? My heart!
(Matt.15:8; Hosea 6:6)

Integrity: Whole or undivided. Living in such a way that your heart, words, and actions are aligned with God’s truth – not divided between what you say and what you do. It’s the foundation that holds godly character together.

The Boundary of Integrity — Staying Separate from Corruption (v14–18)

Integrity means guarding what influences your heart. 1Cor.15:33
The best defense against the lies in this world is the delight
(pleasure) of God’s Word in your heart. (Ps.1:1-3, 19:10, 119:103)

What voices are shaping your values?

What relationships are pulling you closer to Christ – and which ones are pulling you away?

Growing Notes

- 1) What does it mean to “build your house on the rock” (Matthew 7:24)?
- 2) How does Paul’s warning in 2 Corinthians 6:1 challenge you to live consistently with God’s grace?
- 3) Which of Paul’s hardships in verses 4-10 can you relate to most, and how did integrity guide your response?
- 4) What does “opening wide your heart” (v11) look like in your relationships today?
- 5) How can believers stay “separate from the world” without becoming judgmental or isolated?
- 6) What specific area of integrity is God calling you to strengthen this week?

God is > My Highs/Lows
“Life of Integrity” (2Cor. 6:1-18)

Imagine two house builders – one wise and one foolish.
(Matt.7:24-27)

Integrity is the foundation of your life that no one sees but God. It’s who you are when no one is looking. You can build a life that looks impressive on the outside—talent, success, reputation—but if the foundation isn’t built on truth, obedience, and character, the storms of life will expose it.

Paul lived this truth. In 2 Corinthians 6, Paul shows us what it means to live a life of integrity – to remain faithful, steadfast, and real when life’s highs and lows test the strength of your foundation.

The Call to Integrity – Living Consistent with God’s Grace
(v1–2)

Integrity starts with **grace** . (2Cor.8:9, 9:8; 2Pet.1:3)

Responsibility (“response-ability”): ability to choose your response. You are a **product** of your past but not a **prisoner** unless you choose to be. Healing begins when Hiding and Hurling (blaming) ends.

The Test of Integrity – Enduring Hardships with Faithfulness
(v3–10)

True Character is shown by the **choices** a person makes under pressure—the tougher the situation, the clearer we see who they really are. Integrity is what keeps those choices honest, consistent, and guided by what is right, even when it's hard.
(James 1:2-4; Rom.5:3-5)

Godly Character (proactive/spirit): behavior is the product of your **choices** based on **values** .

Ungodly Character (reactive/flesh): behavior is the product of your **feelings** based on **circumstances** .
