Preaching - Proclaiming God's Kingdom
Healing - Displaying God's power and compassion

In Conclusion:

The King's Mission is still ongoing.

The call for repentance still rings loudly today. Hearts and souls are still on the line! Where do you stand in regard to the King's mission?

If you are hiding in darkness - turn and RUN to Jesus

If you are holding on to your nets - Leave them! The short-term gain is nothing compared to the long-term reward.

Growing Notes

Think about a time someone invited you to be part of something meaningful (a team, project, job, ministry, etc.). What made you say yes—or hesitate? What did it cost you to join?

Jesus begins His ministry with the message, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

Why do you think repentance is the starting point for understanding Jesus' mission? What does it reveal about humanity's greatest need?

When Jesus calls Peter, Andrew, James, and John, they leave their nets "at once."

What might have been going through their minds in that moment?
What would it realistically take for someone today to respond to Jesus with that level of urgency?

Crowds followed Jesus from many regions, but later in the Gospel, we see that not everyone who followed Him stayed committed.

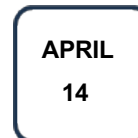

A King Like No Other

The King's Mission (Matthew 4:12-25)

The first half of Matthew 4 tells us that Jesus didn't come to this earth to mess around... He came with a mission in mind, and nothing would distract Him from it. Even after a 40 day fast in the wilderness, He looked Satan in the eye three times and rebuffed the devil's lies.

The second half of chapter 4 reveals the main point of His Mission (4:17 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.")

This big reveal tells us that:

Jesus didn't come merely to start a religion
He didn't come to collect fans and be admired
He didn't come to overthrow Rome

He came as a King... on a MISSION to capture hearts and souls, no matter what the cost.

The King's Mission brought light into dark places v. 12-16, John 1:4-5, John 8:12, Colossians 1:13
Jesus didn't retreat in fear - He repositioned for the Mission MORE

The King's Mission calls for repentance and change (From me to He) v. 17, Matthew 3:2, Matthew 10:7, Luke 5:32, 2 Peter 3:9
Repentance is not feeling bad, its embracing a new direction that leads to a new life.

The King's Mission contains a priority, identity, and purpose v. 18-22, Matthew 6:33, Romans 8:12-17, Matthew 28:19-20

Priority - "Leave your nets and follow Me"
