

CAMPAIGN ANNOUNCEMENT AT THE JULY POTLUCK

At St. Dunstan, we have the joyful problem of growing and exceeding our facility's capacity for worship, ministry activities, and discipleship of new members and children. The St. Dunstan Growth Campaign is about laying the foundation to expand our capacity to share the Gospel, now and into the future. God has provided us a way for future growth. We have stepped out in faith, as those before us, to follow God's lead.

- ★ While we have reorganized the Nave and added pews, our max capacity is 120. On recent occasions, we have exceeded this number and have used the parish hall for the overflow. History tells us that when Sunday attendance exceeds 80% of the seating capacity, church seating becomes crowded and discourages visitors from returning. Members often become uncomfortable worshiping in crowded pews.
- ★ Our Campaign's part of wider vision of greater capacity of our existing campus is to begin intentional preparations for future expansion —development and building. This will allow us to reach more people with space to accommodate these goals—parking, visibility in the community, children and youth activities, outreach capabilities, activities with APNET or the community, etc.

God has miraculously provided us a way forward. If we are to continue growing, as cathedrals of the past have shown us, future generations depend on what we do today. We have stepped out in faith to follow God's lead.

Since our existing property is not large enough to enable remodeling our current footpring, the Vestry has chosen a long-range goal of purchasing the property on North Pacific Street that borders our Church property. This will provide us with the opportunity to have greater exposure of our church to those travelling on North Pacific Street, turning the property into additional parking and creating greater visibility.
