



FROM OUR RECTOR:

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Next month, on Pearl Harbour Day, St. Dunstan's has its Annual Parish Meeting. For some reason, this does not seem to fill many parishioners with joyful anticipation and delight (yes, you should read that with a bit of a sarcastic note). Many people dread meetings. Yes, this is definitely "a meeting" with reports, budgets, and discussions with differing viewpoints. However, it's inappropriate to reduce that gathering to just another meeting, something to be avoided. This isn't simply a plea to show up and vote. It's an invitation to think about what it is to be part of the church (whether or not it leads you to be there). Without any doubt, we do want more and more people to be a part of our congregation and to be together in worship on Sundays. The point of that isn't a large attendance, but to see as many people as possible to have a transformative encounter with the Living God and to become a part of the company of disciples - the church. The church isn't simply an institution (though we are organized and have structures), nor something someone simply "attends", as though it is an event or experience. The church isn't a service provider (though we are agents of grace and care in our communities). We certainly aren't a club. We are an outpost of the Kingdom of God, walking together as believers in The Way, and to display the Gospel in and to the world. It demands of us a sharing of our lives, gifts, and hearts with one another. This is where the meeting comes in: every family needs to have ways to work together, opportunities to reflect, and to plan. The Annual Parish Meeting is about these organizational things, but also more than that. It is to reflect on what has happened. It is to plan how to steward what God has given us to carry out our mission

- our "why" - in the year ahead (Matthew 28). It is also very much about committing ourselves to one another and to our discipleship. So, yes, I am encouraging you to attend the meeting and to participate in it. As you do, please do so prayerfully. We don't simply make decisions, but seek discernment. We want to be led by the Holy Spirit. We want to be united together in Christ Jesus. This is a supernatural thing that comes as we submit together to Him and give ourselves to Him and to one another.
