Meeting Neighbors Where They Are

When congregations across the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod share Mission Support, they are participating in something much bigger than any one ministry. Together, we are making it possible for congregations to dream, collaborate, and step into new ways of loving, healing, and engaging like Jesus.

One powerful example comes from St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Birdsboro, whose Witness & Service Grant helped support their Our Daily Bread Mobile Food Ministry. What began as an idea discussed for years became a reality through faith, partnership, and community support. Within just a few months, they raised \$54,000 to launch a fully equipped mobile kitchen, allowing them to bring meals directly to people in need.

Today, that mobile kitchen is on the move, serving at veterans' events, supporting local outreach efforts, partnering with other ministries, and showing up in places where people may not otherwise experience the Church. Rather than waiting for neighbors to come through their doors, St. Mark's is going out to meet people where they are, offering both nourishment and connection.

Through this ministry, relationships are being built across congregations, nonprofits, and community organizations. Volunteers and partners are working side by side, and new connections continue to grow. As those involved share, they see God at work in the faces and stories of the people they serve, reminding them that those they encounter are "the treasures of the Church."

This is what Mission Support makes possible.



unchurched for years but are still hungry for connection and meaning. These ministries remind me that the Gospel is not confined to a sanctuary. It lives in fields, fellowship halls, parking lots, and conversations with people who are searching for belonging.



Looking ahead, I'm excited to continue deepening relationships within the Pretzel City Parish. I've come to cherish the everyday moments—the conversations, the intergenerational gatherings, the unexpected holy interruptions—where God quietly draws us closer to one another. My hope is that through these moments, people feel more seen, more connected, and more aware of God's love at work in their lives.

If someone were considering the Licensed Lay Minister pathway, I would tell them this: you don't need to have everything figured out. You don't need to feel certain or strong. The most surprising part of my journey has been discovering how God works through my vulnerability far more than through my confidence. Again and again, I've learned that ministry is not about our strength, but about God's.

I am deeply grateful for the synod's support and their commitment to developing lay leadership. Their encouragement, guidance, and investment in creating pathways for people like me have made this journey possible. It has reminded me that God calls people from all walks of life into meaningful ministry—and that the church is stronger when we answer those calls together.

I began this journey quietly, almost reluctantly. But each step has revealed a little more of what God is doing—not just in me, but also through me, and in the congregations and communities I'm blessed to serve. My prayer is simply to keep saying yes, one invitation at a time, trusting that the Spirit will continue to lead the way.

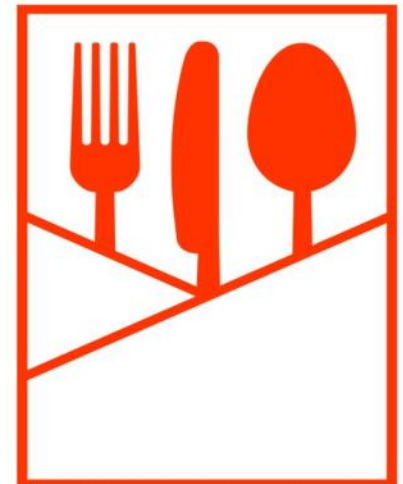

I know the deadline has past, but it is a serious issue, and you can read this summary to get a sense of what the issues are to educate yourself on this matter.

Health Professionals Letter to Support Monitoring Microplastics in the UCMR 6

This is a summary of the main points. The deadline for signature was May 14, 2026.

As health care and public health professionals or an organization representing health care and public health professionals, we are writing to express our grave concern regarding the pervasiveness of microplastics and their presence in our nation's drinking water. We therefore urge the EPA to include microplastics in the Sixth Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR 6).

The clinical and scientific evidence regarding the health impacts of microplastics is deeply concerning:

- **Systemic Accumulation:** Microplastics can accumulate in human cells, tissues, and organs, potentially causing cellular damage, allergic responses, and early cell death.
- **Vulnerable Populations:** Infants and children are at heightened risk due to exposure in the womb and a lack of developed defense mechanisms. Early-life exposure is linked to lung inflammation, impaired kidney function, and potential neurodevelopmental impairments. Studies have confirmed plastic particles can cross the placental barrier to reach the fetus.
- **Chronic Health Risks:** Research has linked microplastic exposure to various cancers, immune system disruption, and developmental or reproductive harm. Recent research has identified microplastic accumulation in lung, breast, and colorectal cancerous tissues.
- **Unequal Impacts:** Low-income, marginalized communities of color are disproportionately affected by microplastic pollution, often exposed at greater rates due to factors like diets, locations near sources, and tendencies to rely more on bottled water. The historically extractive nature and lifecycle of general plastic pollution makes the contamination of air, water, and soils in overburdened communities largely unavoidable.

We all need to make the effort to educate ourselves and to think of ways to limit microplastics in our lives.

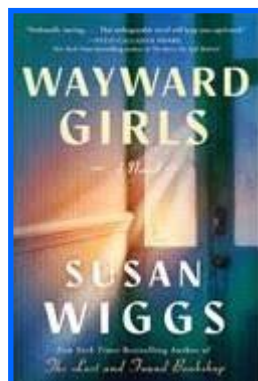
We will celebrate our designation as a **Reconciled In Christ** congregation with an **RIC** special envelop on International Pride Day, June 28th.

Set in the turbulent Vietnam era in the All-American city of Buffalo, New York, six girls are condemned to forced labor in the laundry of a Catholic reform school. In 1968 we meet six teens confined at the Good Shepherd—a dark and secretive institution controlled by Sisters of Charity nuns—locked away merely for being gay, pregnant, or simply unruly. Mairin—free-spirited daughter of Irish immigrants, committed to keep her safe from her stepfather. Angela—denounced for her attraction to girls, sent to the nuns for reform, but instead found herself the victim of a predator. Helen—the daughter of intellectuals detained in Communist China, she saw her “temporary” stay at the Good Shepherd stretch into years. Odessa—caught up in a police dragnet over a racial incident, she found the physical and mental toughness to endure her sentence. Denise—sentenced for brawling in a foster home, she dared to dream of a better life. Janice—deeply insecure, she couldn’t decide where her loyalty lay—except when it came to her friend Kay, who would never outgrow her childlike dependency. Sister Bernadette—rescued from a dreadful childhood, she owed her loyalty to the Sisters of Charity even as her conscience weighed on her. Wayward Girls is a haunting but thrilling tale of hope, solidarity, and the enduring strength of young women who find the courage to break free and find redemption...and justice.
