Show Me Your Glory

- In Exodus 34:6, God speaks 5 words/ideas to reveal the shining brightness of His Glory.
 - These are some of the things that set God apart from all other beings.
- If you are going to know, understand and relate to God, these are some of the things you need to know about Him.
 - The Scriptures and History are a Testament to these characteristics of God.
 - Old Testament, New Testament

Exodus 34:6

6 And the LORD passed before him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth

Exodus 34:6

- Merciful
- Gracious
- Longsuffering
- Abounding in Goodness
- Abounding in Truth



(and Jesus is the proof)

Exodus 34:6

- Merciful = full of compassion
- Gracious = full of love, kind, giving,
- Longsuffering = slow to anger, patient
- Goodness = loyal love

- Abounding in Truth = trustworthy, faithful

Abounding in Truth

- Hebrew word = 'emet
= truth (as in True to your Word),
trustworthy, Faithful

Idea

- God is trustworthy, therefore, you can Trust Him.
- God is faithful. This initiates our personal Faith.
- Conveys the idea of stability, steadfastness,
certainty, reliable

Abounding in Truth

- Faith from a Biblical perspective is not blind.
- There are good reasons to believe in the trustworthiness of God.

Let's look at how “emet” is used in Scripture.

Psalm 19:7

The Law of the LORD is perfect,
converting the soul; The testimony of
the LORD is sure (emet), making wise
the simple;

Psalm 25:5

Lead me in Your truth (**emet**) and teach me, For You are the God of my salvation; On You I wait all the day.

Psalm 36:5-6

5 Your **mercy (loyal love)**, O LORD, is in the heavens; Your **faithfulness (emet)** reaches to the clouds.

6 Your righteousness is like the great mountains; Your judgments are a great deep; O LORD, You preserve man and beast.

Psalm 40:11

Do not withhold Your tender mercies
from me, O LORD; Let Your
lovingkindness (loyal love) and
Your **truth** (emet)
continually preserve me.

Psalm 119:160

The entirety of Your word
is truth (emet), and every one
of Your righteous judgments
endures forever.

Here's a similar Hebrew word to emet

Psalm 72:19

And blessed be His glorious name forever! And let the whole earth be filled with His glory. Amen and Amen.

• Amen = “That’s the Truth”

**Scriptures Speaking of Stability, Reliability,
Constancy & Security**

Isaiah 40:8

**The grass withers, the flower fades,
But the word of our God stands forever.**

Isaiah 55:10-11

10 "For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, and do not return there, But water the earth, and make it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower and bread to the eater,

11 So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, but it **shall accomplish** what I please, and it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.

Psalm 18:2

The LORD is my rock and my fortress
and my deliverer; My God,
my strength, in whom I will trust;
My shield and the horn of my
salvation, my stronghold.

Psalm 61:2

From the end of the earth
I will cry to You, when my heart is
overwhelmed; Lead me to the rock
that is higher than I.

God is faithful >>> you can put your faith in Him.

**Because of The LORD's faithfulness,
we can have faith. (believe)**

God is trustworthy >>> worthy of your Trust.

**Because God is trustworthy,
we can put our trust in Him.**

Here's what "faith" looks like...

Genesis 15:5-6

5 Then He brought him outside and said, "Look now toward heaven, and count the stars if you are able to number them." And He said to him, "So shall your descendants be."

6 And he believed in the LORD, and He accounted it to him for righteousness.

Romans 4:16-25

16 Therefore it is of faith that it might be according to grace, so that the promise might be sure to all the seed, not only to those who are of the law, but also to those who are of the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all

17 (as it is written, "I have made you a father of many nations") in the presence of Him whom he believed--God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did;

Romans 4:16-25

18 who, contrary to hope, in hope believed, so that he became the father of many nations, according to what was spoken, "So shall your descendants be."

19 And not being weak in faith, he did not consider his own body, already dead (since he was about a hundred years old), and the deadness of Sarah's womb.

Romans 4:16-25

20 He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God,

21 and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform.

22 And therefore "it was accounted to him for righteousness."

Romans 4:16-25

23 Now it was not written for his sake alone that it was imputed to him,
24 but also for us. It shall be imputed to us who believe in Him who raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead,
25 who was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our justification.

John 1:1, 10-14

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

10 He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him.

11 He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him.

John 1:1, 10-14

12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name:

13 who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. (faithfulness, trustworthy)
