When you look at what Jesus’ said in **John 10: 10**, you’ll learn that He wants you to discover what it really means to live.

Sadly, many people have thought that the way to experience full life is through using religious activity to make up for the wrong things we have done in our lives. The bad news is that no amount of good can overcome how our sin separates us from God

A good way to understand this is to look at **Romans 6:23**. It talks about how we all share a common experience that leaves us in desperate need of a Savior.

There are three words that are really important: **wages**, **sin** and **death**.

If you look at the word **wage**, what do you think of? Most of us think of a paycheck. We get a paycheck that we believe we deserve. This verse says that we have a paycheck coming for something: **sin**.

Sin literally means missing the mark. Every day, every one of us miss the mark when it comes to comparing our lives to a perfect God. That sin separates us from God and that leads to something that is tragic: **death**.

Death is not just a physical reality. There is a spiritual “death” to which this verse is referring. It is spiritual separation from God. Our deepest desire is to experience a right relationship with God, but we cannot close the gap between us and God on our own...

For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord

THE GOOD NEWS IS WHAT GOD DID...

In **Romans 5:8**, the Bible said that when we were still broken and separated from God because of our sin, that God reached out in love through Jesus.

Jesus came and lived a perfect life so that He could offer His life as a sacrifice for our sin. Someone had to pay the penalty for our sin, and if Jesus would not have died on our behalf, we would have been separated from God forever. But Jesus **DID** die for us, and we have the opportunity to find forgiveness for our sin and the ability to experience life both now and for eternity because of that sacrifice.

God simply asks that we make a conscious decision of our **WILL** to say YES to trusting Jesus alone for salvation. It is through believing and receiving what Jesus did, not our religious activity that we can be made right with God.

SOMETHING TO CLOSE THE GAP BETWEEN US AND HIM...



The second half of **Romans 6:23** helps us understand this more clearly. Let's look at these three words: **gift**, **God**, and **eternal life**.

Whether or not we realize it, we have tried to close the gap of separation on our own. How? Being a good person, giving money away, and even church attendance are some of the ways we have tried. God is not impressed with our efforts because we will never compare to His perfection. So, His response was to offer us a free **gift**.

This gift comes from His heart. **God** knew that we would always fall short and would always be separated from Him. So, He gave us a gift that we could not earn on our own.

This gift of God is the **eternal life** that we have available to us because of Jesus. Jesus lived a perfect life and then sacrificed Himself in our place to pay the penalty for our sin debt. He died so that we could live.

YOU HAVE A CHOICE TO SAY YES TO JESUS BY ACCEPTING GOD'S GIFT

Forgiveness of our sins is a gift of God. It comes when we accept what Jesus did for us. His death and resurrection for our sins provides forgiveness and enables us to have a right relationship with God.

A gift isn't a gift until it has been accepted. We must individually accept that Jesus Christ saves us from our sins to receive eternal life.

If you openly declare that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by openly declaring your faith that you are saved. Romans 10:9-10 NLT

HERE ARE FOUR QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF:

1. Do I know that God loves me and has a plan for my life?
2. Do I know that I have sinned and that my sin is a barrier to my relationship with God?
3. Do I believe that Jesus Christ paid the penalty for my sin and is the only way to find forgiveness for my sins?
4. Have I accepted Jesus as my Savior by believing in Him, by saying YES to Him?

If you want to begin a relationship with God through Jesus Christ right now, you can, by talking to him through prayer.

"God, I confess that I am a sinner, and I believe that Jesus died to pay for my sins and then rose from the dead for me. Today, I say YES to following you by accepting you into my life. I turn from my way of doing things, to your way, and give you control of my life. I accept you and you alone as the only way to have my sins forgiven and the only way to have a right relationship with you. Thank you for saving me and giving me new life in you. Amen."

S.O.A.P. METHOD

How to read your Bible

S **Scripture:** Write out a verse or passage of Scripture that speaks to your heart.

O **Observation:** What stood out to you about this passage? Were there any commands or instructions? What is the author saying?

A **Application:** How can you apply this verse to your life today? How can you live in light of this truth?

P **Pray:** Respond to this passage in prayer. Ask God to help you apply this Scripture to your life and spend some time listening to what God is telling you.
